QUESTIONS FOR FURTHER REFLECTION:

- 1. Take a few minutes and read Luke 8:3-21 with your group. The message today centered on verses 3-15. Take some time as a group to connect the parable of the soils with Jesus' illustration of the lamp and scene with his mother and brothers. How are these linked?
