Welcome to your Maundy Thursday at home service!

Read through the directions below before you begin. To participate in Communion later in the service you will need bread and juice. (Or whatever you have on hand to use!)

The second page of this document is an optional coloring page for kids if you have the ability to print it. During each of the six middle readings, you can encourage kids to find an image that goes with that reading. If you can't print the page, you can always just help them look for it on a screen. There are also discussion questions on this page you can use while you eat dinner in between the readings.

Foot Washing Activity:

Before you press play on the video we invite you to participate in a foot-washing activity. This is not required, but it is way we can symbolically remember and experience Jesus washing the feet of the disciples at the last supper.

At the church, we are doing a simple version of this by pouring water over each others feet, and using a towel to dry them off. You can do it in the same way, or whatever makes sense for you and whoever you may be participating with.

Say this blessing after you are done with the activity:

Tonight we reminding ourselves of our call to servant leadership by washing each other's feet - recalling our baptism and as a sign of our commitment to follow in the footsteps of Jesus to love others as He did. May these feet be blessed and be a blessing as we go.

Dinner Service:

At this point we invite you to watch this video and participate during your dinner this evening. It will give you directions as you watch on what to do.

Thank you for joining us from home tonight, we are praying that this experience was a blessing to you, and we are grateful for your participation in drawing closer to Jesus tonight.
