ON TV/**OUTLINE**: "I must proclaim the good news of the kingdom of God...because this is why I was sent. "Luke 4:43

ON TV/OUTLINE: "25 On one occasion, an expert in the law stood up to test Jesus. 'Teacher,' he asked, 'what must I do to inherit eternal life?' 26 'What is written in the law' he replied, 'How do you read it?' 27a 'Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your strength and with all you mind...' Luke 10:25-27a

ON TV: Love for God is **demonstrated by love for others**.

ON TV/**OUTLINE**: "27b '...and love your neighbor as yourself.' 28 'You have answered correctly,' Jesus replied. 'Do this and you will live.'" Luke 10:27b-28

ON TV/**OUTLINE**: "But he wanted to justify himself, so he asked Jesus, 'And who is my neighbor?" Luke 10:29

ON TV: What does loving your neighbor look like and what does loving your neighbor act like?

ON TV: What is God like?

ON TV: This is what it looks like to follow me, because this is what your Father in Heaven is like.

ON TV/OUTLINE: "33 But a Samaritan, as he traveled, came where the man was; and when he saw him, he took pity on him. 34 He went to him and bandaged his wounds, pouring on oil and wine. Then he put the man on his own donkey and brought him to an inn and took care of him." Luke 10:33-34

ON TV/OUTLINE: "35 The next day he took out two denarii and gave them to the innkeeper. 'Look after him,' he said, 'and when I return, I will reimburse you for any extra expense you may have.'" Luke 10:35

ON TV/**OUTLINE**: "Which of these three do you think was a neighbor to the man who fell into the hands of robbers?" Luke 10:36

ON TV: Which of these three loved God with all his heart, soul, mind, and strength by loving a stranger as himself?

ON TV/OUTLINE: "The expert in the law replied, 'The one who had mercy on him.' Jesus told him, 'Go and do likewise.'" Luke 10:37

ON TV: Jesus was basically saying, "Just go. Be the Samaritan in the parable."

ON TV: Because God's love has **no boundaries** or **limits**.

ON TV: Which one of the three do you and I think was a **neighbor** to the man who fell into the hands of robbers?
