## HOW WE SHARE Fallout – *Part 3*

**ON TV:** The foundation of faith for the first century Christ Followers was an **event**: the **resurrection of Jesus**.

**ON TV:** Keeping the Law of Moses is a **condition for salvation and inclusion**.

**ON TV/OUTLINE:** "1 Certain people came down from Judea to Antioch and were teaching the believers: 'Unless you are circumcised according to the custom of Moses, you cannot be saved. 2 This brought Paul and Barnabas into sharp dispute and debate with them. So, Paul and Barnabas were appointed, along with some other believers, to go up to Jerusalem to see the apostles and elders about this question." Acts 15:1-2

**ON TV: Why** would they go back to Jerusalem to sort this out, and **why** would they need to meet with this group of apostles?

**ON TV:** Is the **Gentile's relationship** to the Law of Moses or is it to Jesus and the New Covenant he inaugurated?

**ON TV:** But 20 years after the resurrection, the church is trying to figure out: **Is this for everybody for all times?** Do we keep it **all** or just **part** of it? Do the Gentiles have to **live and believe like Jews** to become Christians?

**ON TV/OUTLINE:** "5 Then some of the believers who belonged to the party of the **Pharisees** stood up and said, 'The Gentiles must be circumcised and required to keep the Law of Moses.' 7 After much discussion, Peter got up and addressed them: 'Brothers, you know that sometime ago God made a choice among you that the Gentiles might hear from my lips the message of the gospel and believe. 8 God, who knows the heart, showed that he accepted them by giving the Holy Spirit to them, just as he did to us. 10 Now then, why do you try to test God by putting on the necks of Gentiles a yoke that neither we nor our ancestors have been able to bear? 11 No! We believe it is through the grace of our Lord Jesus that we are saved, just as they are.'" Acts 15:5, 7-8, 10-11

**ON TV/OUTLINE:** "19 It is my judgement, therefore, that we should not make it difficult for the Gentiles who are turning to God. 20 Instead we should write to them, telling them to abstain from food polluted by idols, from sexual immorality, from the meat of strangled animals and from blood. 21 For the Law of Moses has been preached in every city from the earliest times and is read in the synagogues on every Sabbath." Acts 15:19-21

**ON TV:** Why would James suggest they send this particular message to Gentile Christians?

**ON TV:** Because those commands had nothing to do with keeping the Law of Moses but had everything to do with keeping the peace in the church.

**ON TV:** It was all about **peacekeeping**, not law keeping.

**ON TV:** Yours are better and yours are far less complicated...but they are far more demanding.

**ON TV:** This new covenant stands on its own two, nail-scarred, resurrected feet.

**ON TV:** Those 66 books did not start Christianity. The resurrection of Jesus created and launched Christianity.

**ON TV:** Did Jesus rise from the dead?

**ON TV:** "...we should not make it difficult for those Gentiles who are turning to God." Acts 15:19b
