#### Love and War

2 Corinthians 10:1-11 February 14, 2021 | Jason Finley, Lead Pastor for Equipping

BIG IDEA: Christ's love urges us to love those who are hard-to-love.

#### I. Humble yourself. (vv. 1, 9-10)

2 Corinthians 10:1 | <sup>1</sup>I, Paul, myself entreat you, by the meekness and gentleness of Christ—I who am humble when face to face with you, but bold toward you when I am away!—

2 Corinthians 10:9-10 | 9 I do not want to appear to be frightening you with my letters. <sup>10</sup> For they say, "His letters are weighty and strong, but his bodily presence is weak, and his speech of no account."

Matthew 11:28-30 | <sup>28</sup> Come to me, all who labor and are heavy laden, and I will give you rest. <sup>29</sup>Take my yoke upon you, and learn from me, for I am <u>gentle and lowly in heart</u>, and you will find rest for your souls. <sup>30</sup> For my yoke is easy, and my burden is light."

1 Timothy 6:11 | <sup>11</sup>But as for you, O man of God, flee these things. Pursue righteousness, godliness, faith, love, steadfastness, gentleness.

## II. Stay in the fight. (vv. 2-3)

2 Corinthians  $10:2-3 \mid ^2$ I beg of you that when I am present I may not have to show boldness with such confidence as I count on showing against some who suspect us of walking according to the flesh.  $^3$ For though we walk in the flesh, we are not waging war according to the flesh.

### III. Love with the truth. (vv. 4-8, 11)

2 Corinthians 10:4-8 | <sup>4</sup>For the weapons of our warfare are not of the flesh but have divine power to destroy strongholds. <sup>5</sup>We destroy arguments and every lofty opinion raised against the knowledge of God, and take every thought captive to obey Christ, <sup>6</sup> being ready to punish every disobedience, when your obedience is complete. <sup>7</sup>Look at what is before your eyes. If anyone is confident that he is Christ's, let him remind himself that just as he is Christ's, so also are we. <sup>8</sup> For even if I boast a little too much of our authority, which the Lord gave for building you up and not for destroying you, I will not be ashamed.

2 Corinthians 10:11 |  $^{11}$ Let such a person understand that what we say by letter when absent, we do when present.

 $1 \, \text{Peter 2:} 11 \, | \, ^{11} \, \text{Beloved}$ , I urge you as sojourners and exiles to abstain from the passions of the flesh, which wage war against your soul.
