## **Encourage One Another**

1 Thessalonians 5:8-11 July 9, 2023 | Ken Lewis, Legacy Pastor

Big Idea: Encourage one another in the faith with the Gospel.

I. What is biblical encouragement? (vv. 11-12)

Comfort/Console Encourage/Exhort
(Solace – refresh) (Urge – persuasive discourse)

- 1. Examples of encouragement in the bible
  - a. Moses and Joshua (Deut. 1:38; 3:27-28)
  - b. King Hezekiah and his commanders (2 Chron. 32:6-8)
  - c. Jonathan and David (1 Sam. 23:15-18)
  - d. Barnabas (son of encouragement) and the church (Acts 4:34-37), Paul (Acts 9:26-27),
  - e. Christians in Antioch (Acts 11:20-26), John Mark (Acts 20:1-2)
  - f. Apostle Paul and Ephesian disciples, churches in Macedonia (Acts 20:1-2; 1Thess. 2:11-12)

2. Flattery is not encouragement (1 Thess. 2:5)

- II. Why do we need encouragement? (v. 14)
  - 1. Suffering (1 Thess. 1:6; 3:1-4; 2 Thess. 1:4)
  - 2. Sorrow (1 Thess. 4:13-18)
  - 3. Sin (Heb. 3:12-13)
  - 4. Satan (1 Thess. 3:5)

## III. How do we encourage one another? (vv. 6-8)

- 1. Live the gospel (Walk)
- 2. Speak the gospel (Word)
  - a. Point out the evidence of God's grace in others lives.
  - b. Point out the work of God's grace evident in the gospel.
  - c. Point to Jesus; encourage others to see his presence, promises, and power (Heb. 12:3; 2 Timothy 4:16-18).

## IV. How can you grow as an encourager?

- 1. Pray for God to make you an encourager.
- 2. Daily encourage yourself in the Lord (Jude 17-21).
- 3. Be full of the Holy Spirit and of faith.
- 4. Faithfully pray for others.
