2) SUMMARY: "In 1 Tim 2:15, Paul says that women will be spiritually preserved (from Satan) by adhering to their God-ordained role related to family and the home. This is contrasted with Eve, who transgressed those boundaries and fell into temptation. The way I construe the logic of 1 Tim 2:12-15 is as follows. In v.12, Paul sets boundaries for women in the church. In vv.13-14, Paul gives two reasons for this: (1) creation order: the man was created first, then the woman (v.13); (2) the scenario at the Fall: rather than God-man-woman-Satan, a complete reversal had taken place: Satan-woman-man-God. In v.15, Paul addresses the question, 'How can women today avoid the mistake made by Eve?' The answer: By adhering to their God-given boundaries and tending to their God-given responsibilities."

Week 6 Questions to Ponder

- 1. Reflect back on the study of 1 Timothy 2:9-15. How has your understanding of this passage changed? Or, how has this study solidified your convictions? Be prepared to discuss this with your small group.
- 2. I briefly addressed that *modesty* was a state of mind where a woman's reverence for God and regard for others is primary. It is an inward motivation and disposition expressed in the way she dresses. Does the way you dress express this? Explain.
- 3. We saw in 1 Timothy 2:11 that Paul assumed women would be learning (the context being spiritual things). He then goes on to explain how a woman is to learn. What are some ways you are actively "learning?" If you are not pursuing learning, develop a plan to start.
- 4. After studying several New Testament passages about biblical womanhood in the home and church, why was it necessary that we started this study, *I Am Woman*, *Let's Restore*, with Genesis 1-3? (Reference 1 Timothy 2:13-14.)
- 5. From 1 Corinthians 11:2-12, we saw that "wearing a head covering" was an external sign of submission for the women in the NT culture. It communicated a submissive demeanor and feminine adornment. Since we do not have a symbol like this today, what are some ways we can communicate a submissive demeanor and feminine adornment?
- 6. Respond to the Final Challenge given in the talk, *Biblical Womanhood in the Church*: What are you adorning yourself with? Is it the inner disposition and attitude of submission manifesting itself in modesty, self-control, and good works?
- 7. Take some time to think about and write out possible opportunities for women in kingdom ministry that aligns with what Scripture teaches concerning biblical womanhood. Note those that interest you most. Be prepared to share this with your small group.
- 8. Next week we will be looking at examples of godly women leaders in Scripture. Read and write your observations this week from Judges 4-5, 1 Samuel 25, Esther, and Acts 18:24-28.
