## Joseph Accepts Jesus as His Son

This is how the birth of Jesus the Messiah came about[d]: His mother Mary was pledged to be married to Joseph, but before they came together, she was found to be pregnant through the Holy Spirit. Because Joseph her husband was faithful to the law, and yet[e] did not want to expose her to public disgrace, he had in mind to divorce her quietly.

But after he had considered this, an angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream and said, "Joseph son of David, do not be afraid to take Mary home as your wife, because what is conceived in her is from the Holy Spirit. She will give birth to a son, and you are to give him the name Jesus, [f] because he will save his people from their sins."

All this took place to fulfill what the Lord had said through the prophet: "The virgin will conceive and give birth to a son, and they will call him Immanuel"[g] (which means "God with us"). When Joseph woke up, he did what the angel of the Lord had commanded him and took Mary home as his wife. But he did not consummate their marriage until she gave birth to a son. And he gave him the name Jesus.

How did Joseph worship the King? He worshiped through obedience.

- 2. Despite his reputation
- 3. Despite the customs of that time

Application - How do we worship the King? Obedience and faithfulness to God trumps all other voices. We worship the King by knowing his voice and obeying it.

## The Magi Visit the Messiah

After Jesus was born in Bethlehem in Judea, during the time of King Herod, Magi from the east came to Jerusalem and asked, "Where is the one who has been born king of the Jews? We saw his star when it rose and have come to worship him."

When King Herod heard this he was disturbed, and all Jerusalem with him. When he had called together all the people's chief priests and teachers of the law, he asked them where the Messiah was to be born. "In Bethlehem in Judea," they replied, "for this is what the prophet has written:

"But you, Bethlehem, in the land of Judah,

And having been warned in a dream not to go back to Herod, they returned to their country by another route.

How did Herod worship the King?

Application - How do we worship the King? Worshiping Jesus requires us to stop worshipping ourselves. Jealousy of others may turn our hearts away from God. We cannot worship God and man. We can only have one master.

How did the Magi worship the King?

- 3. They bowed down.
- 4. They brought him treasures.
- 5. They followed the warning signs.

Application - How do we worship the King? Worship is an outward expression of an inward conviction. Our worship should draw us to God, fill us with joy and reverence. We should give God our very best of our time, talent, and treasure. Our worship unto God keeps us alert for wolves dressed in sheep's clothing. We worship the King by loving him with all our heart, mind, soul and strength.
