

5 Day Devotional Guide

Great Power, Great Grace

Day 1: All In Need | Scripture: Acts 4:23-31

Devotional: The early church didn't pray casually—they prayed desperately. When threats came, they didn't strategize or compromise; they cried out for boldness. Their prayer wasn't "God, make this easier," but "God, we need ALL of You!" When we recognize our complete dependence on God, we position ourselves for His power. Today, examine your prayer life. Are you praying politely or desperately? The disciples' prayer shook the building because it shook heaven first. God responds to those who recognize they cannot succeed without Him. Stop trying to manage life with partial surrender. Bring your desperate need before God today, and watch Him fill you completely with His Spirit and boldness.

Day 2: All In Unity | Scripture: John 17:20-23

Devotional: Jesus prayed that His followers would be "one" so the world would believe. The early church embodied this unity—one heart, one soul, one mission. They didn't just attend the same gatherings; they shared life completely. This wasn't forced or fake but flowed from their shared experience of God's power. Unity isn't uniformity; it's alignment around Jesus' resurrection and mission. When believers stop claiming ownership of their blessings and start viewing everything as resources for God's kingdom, supernatural unity emerges. Ask yourself: Am I contributing to unity or division? Do I view my possessions as mine or as tools for ministry? True unity draws the lost like a magnet because it reflects heaven on earth.

Day 3: All In Grace | Scripture: Ephesians 2:1-10

Devotional: "Great grace was upon them all"—not just some, but ALL. This mega grace wasn't earned through performance but flowed from their new nature in Christ. You are no longer who you were. The power that raised Jesus from the dead lives in you, making you a new creation with inherent spiritual ability. This isn't an upgrade to your old self; it's a complete transformation. The early believers operated in supernatural power because they understood their nature had fundamentally changed. Stop living from your old identity. You have been given great power and great grace—not for self-promotion but to testify that Jesus is alive. Today, walk in the reality of who Christ has made you to be, not who you used to be.

Day 4: All In Ownership | Scripture: Acts 4:32-37

Devotional: "No one claimed that any of their possessions was their own." This radical generosity wasn't communism; it was kingdom living. When you truly believe Jesus is alive and returning soon, your grip on earthly things loosens. The believers didn't sell everything immediately, but when needs arose, they responded sacrificially because they possessed something infinitely more valuable—Jesus Himself. Their possessions didn't possess them. What are you holding onto that God is asking you to release? Perhaps it's not money but time, comfort, reputation, or control. When you have all of God, you have all you need. Generosity prepares the ground for the Spirit's ministry. Your willingness to give creates space for God to move powerfully in your life and through you to others.

Day 5: The Winning Team | Scripture: 1 Corinthians 15:1-20, 50-58

Devotional: Everyone wants to be part of a winning team. The early church wasn't perfect, but they lived with an expectation of victory because they knew Jesus had conquered death. Their joy, power, unity, and generosity drew people magnetically because they embodied resurrection life. You're not on a losing team having your dreams crushed one loss at a time. You serve a risen Savior! This changes everything—how you face challenges, how you love others, how you use resources, how you share your faith. The resurrection isn't just historical fact; it's present power. Live today like Jesus is alive—because He is. You have everything you need in Christ to bring everyone you know to Christ. Stop living small. Great power and great grace rest upon you. Now go be His witness with bold confidence.

Keep Moving Forward: Your Fresh Wind Commitment

As you complete this devotional journey, consider these practical steps to position yourself for God's fresh wind:

Weekly Commitments:

- *Attend Sunday worship consistently (aim for 3+ services monthly)*
- *Join Wednesday prayer gatherings to seek God corporately*
- *Participate in monthly Fresh Wind evening services*
- *Be part of a Discipleship Group*

Daily Practices:

- *Designate specific time for prayer and Scripture reading*
- *Remove one distraction that crowds out time with God*
