

# 5 Day Devotional Guide

*Holy or Hole-y*

**Day 1: Beloved by God** | Scripture: 1 John 3:1-3; Ephesians 1:3-6

Devotional: Before you accomplish anything today, remember your primary identity: you are beloved. God's love for you isn't earned through perfect behavior or spiritual performance—it's the foundation upon which everything else is built. Just as a parent loves their child unconditionally, providing for them not because they've earned it but because of relationship, so God loves you. This divine love transforms how you serve, give, and live. When you operate from a place of being loved rather than trying to earn love, everything changes. Your worship becomes gratitude, your obedience becomes joy, and your service flows from abundance rather than obligation. You are God's beloved child—nothing can separate you from His love.

**Day 2: Rejecting the Comfortable Mess** | 2 Peter 3:1-7; Hebrews 12:1-2

Devotional: We all have "hole-y socks"—comfortable sins, compromises, or doubts we've grown accustomed to wearing. Like worn-out socks that should be discarded, these things no longer serve us well, yet we cling to them out of familiarity. Peter warns against "scoffers" who question God's promises and settle for what's comfortable rather than what's holy. The Christian life requires honest self-examination: What holes exist in your faith? Where have you grown comfortable with "good enough" rather than pursuing God's best? True transformation requires more than acknowledgment—it demands action. Sometimes you need to "rip up" what's familiar to embrace what's whole. God's holiness isn't meant to intimidate you but to invite you into fullness of life. Don't let comfort keep you from completeness.

**Day 3: God's Power, Judgment, and Patience** | Scripture: Ezekiel 18:30-32; Romans 2:1-11

Devotional: Scoffers make three critical mistakes: they reject God's power, dismiss His judgment, and mistake His patience for indifference. But believers embrace all three as essential truths. God's power assures us that He can do immeasurably more than we ask or imagine. His judgment reveals the seriousness of sin and reveals the beauty of His mercy—you cannot appreciate grace without understanding what you've been saved from. His patience isn't approval of sin; it's kindness giving you time to repent. These truths work together: God is powerful enough to save, just enough to judge sin, and patient enough to wait for your return. Don't treat today as guaranteed or tomorrow as certain. God's patience is an invitation. Respond to His kindness with genuine repentance and wholehearted devotion.

**Day 4: Choosing Life Over Death** | Scripture: Deuteronomy 30:15-20; John 3:16-21, 36

Devotional: God presents humanity with a choice: life or death, blessing or curse. There is no neutral ground, no comfortable middle position. Believing in Jesus isn't merely intellectual agreement that He existed or even that He's God—demons believe that much. True faith is complete realignment of your life to follow Jesus, His way, by His Spirit and power. It's not partial commitment or Sunday-only devotion; it's total transformation. This isn't meant to create fear but urgency. Every day is an opportunity to choose life—to walk in obedience, to extend grace, to share the gospel, to live as God's beloved. The world around us faces eternal consequences, and our response matters. Choose life today, not just for yourself but for those God has placed in your sphere of influence.

**Day 5: Singing Heaven's Chorus** | Scripture: Psalm 103:1-14; Philippians 4:4-9

Devotional: Scoffers echo the chorus of hell—mocking, belittling, cursing, and complaining. Believers sing the chorus of heaven—praising, honoring, encouraging, and blessing. What soundtrack plays through your life? Peter calls us to "stir up our pure minds" toward wholesome thinking. Begin each day declaring God's goodness. Throughout your day, speak words that build up rather than tear down. When circumstances tempt you toward complaint, choose gratitude instead. When others gossip, speak truth and honor. Let praise and thanksgiving become the attitude, not just the activity, of your life. Declare God's faithfulness in no matter the circumstance. When you consistently praise God for who He is and what He's done, you align your present circumstances with eternal realities. Heaven's song transforms earthly struggles.
