

5 Day Devotional Guide

In Order For Revival

Day 1: Waiting for the Promise | Scripture: Acts 1:4-8; Luke 24:49

Devotional: Jesus didn't immediately send His disciples out to change the world. He told them to wait. Waiting isn't passive, it's posturing ourselves in desperation for God. The 120 gathered in that upper room weren't casually passing time; they were hungry, expectant, and united in their need for more of Christ. Before you rush into your week, ask yourself: Am I desperate for Jesus? Or am I satisfied with managing my sin on my own? God's greatest work often begins when we stop striving and start waiting in His presence. True power comes not from our ability to work for God, but from our willingness to wait on God. Position yourself today in expectant faith.

Day 2: When God Moves In, Everything Changes | Acts 2:1-4; Ezekiel 36:25-27

Devotional: Throughout the Old Testament, God's presence filled temples and people had to leave. But at Pentecost, God's presence filled the people and remained. This wasn't about cleaning up your act weekly; this was about God moving in permanently to evict the infestation of sin. The Holy Spirit doesn't just forgive your garbage; He transforms your entire house. God's promise through Ezekiel was to give us a new heart and put His Spirit within us. This isn't selective or temporary but for all believers, permanently. Stop treating your relationship with Jesus like weekly trash collection. Invite the Holy Spirit to do deep, transformative work. Let God move in completely, so the old life can move out forever.

Day 3: Filled to Overflow | Scripture: Acts 2:5-12; Joel 2:28-29

Devotional: The Spirit-filled believers didn't speak in confusion—they declared God's wonders in languages they'd never learned, and people from every nation heard the Gospel in their native tongue. This is the miracle: when God fills you, He doesn't do it for your comfort but for others' salvation. The baptism of the Holy Spirit is always in order for revival. God's power in you creates a testimony that draws others in. Notice that God gave both the words to speak and prepared the ears to hear. When you're filled with the Spirit, God orchestrates divine appointments. You become a vessel through which God's power flows to reach the lost. Are you filled to overflow, or just filled enough to feel satisfied?

Day 4: The Miracle of Revival | Scripture: Acts 2:14-41; Romans 10:14-17

Devotional: Revival follows a pattern: Tongue (bold proclamation), Ear (Spirit-prepared hearing), Eye (undeniable signs), and Heart (conviction leading to salvation). Peter, once imperfect and impulsive, was moved out of the way so empowered Peter could preach. Three thousand were saved because the miracle of revival moved from the upper room to the streets. God doesn't fill you so you can stay comfortable in church; He fills you to send you out where the people are. Your testimony—your miracle—is meant to pierce through doubt and create wonder that opens hearts. The move of God in your life is incomplete until it becomes a witness to others. Who is God calling you to reach?

Day 5: Moved Out to Move Others | Scripture: Acts 1:8; Matthew 28:18-20; John 20:21

Devotional: "When God's fresh wind moves in, He moves you out." Jesus didn't baptize us in the Holy Spirit so we could feel spiritual—He did it so we could be witnesses. The purpose of God's power in your life is not your comfort but the salvation of others. Every move of God is so people can come to know Christ. Today, ask the Holy Spirit: "Who are You leading me to declare Your greatness to this year?" Write down the name God brings to mind—a coworker, neighbor, family member, or friend. This is your faith assignment. God is preparing both you and them for a divine encounter. Step into the miracle He wants to work through you. Be filled, be sent, and watch God move.

Moving Forward: Your Fresh Wind Commitment

As you complete this devotional journey, consider these practical steps to position yourself for God's fresh wind:

Weekly Commitments:

- *Attend Sunday worship consistently (aim for 3+ services monthly)*
- *Join Wednesday prayer gatherings to seek God corporately*
- *Participate in monthly Fresh Wind evening services*
- *Engage in the 21-day corporate fast with intentionality*

Daily Practices:

- *Designate specific time for prayer and Scripture reading*
- *Remove one distraction that crowds out time with God*
- *Ask the Holy Spirit to fill you afresh each morning*
- *Invite someone to join you in pursuing God's presence*

Remember: To catch God's fresh wind, show up to the places He's in. Don't let discouragement, distraction, discomfort, or disillusionment cause you to miss what God wants to do. The same Spirit that raised Christ from the dead lives in you, so position yourself to experience His power!

Prayer: Holy Spirit, breathe fresh wind into my life. Remove every obstacle that keeps me from Your fullness. Give me a holy burden to never miss what You're doing. I position myself in the designated spaces You've ordained, expectant and ready to receive all You have for me. Amen.
