



## Three Responses to the Newborn King

The Hostility of Herod: "The Madness of Herod" (v.3, 7-8, 16)

- Herod the Great: Idumean, Romaninstalled, paranoid tyrant
- Has a bloody history
- The Magi's question threatens his throne
- Secretly meets the Magi, pretends he wants to "worship"
- Ultimate response: massacre of the innocents (v. 16)

## Three Responses to the Newborn King

The <u>Indifference</u> of Religious Jerusalem: "The <u>Hatred</u> & <u>Hostility</u> of Israel" (v.3–6)

- The whole city is "troubled" with Herod—not excited about Messiah
- Jerusalem: city of the temple, priests, scribes,
  Scripture—yet completely unaware and uninterested
- Chief priests and scribes quote Micah 5:2
  perfectly but refuse to walk 6 miles to Bethlehem
- Perfect doctrine + zero devotion = spiritual deadness
- Foreshadows Israel's ultimate rejection of Jesus

## Three Responses to the Newborn King

The <u>Joyful</u> Worship of the Magi: "Obedience Leads to <u>Joy</u>, <u>Joy</u> Leads to <u>Worship</u>" (v. 9–11)

- Massive caravan arrives—not three lonely camel riders
- Guided by the star
- Enter a house (not manger) months have passed
- Perfect doctrine + zero devotion = spiritual deadness
- Foreshadows Israel's ultimate rejection of Jesus
- Fall flat on their faces and worship the Child
