THE NATURE OF GOD

He is the supreme <u>Creator</u>, the sovereign <u>King</u>, the righteous <u>Judge</u>, and the merciful <u>Saviour</u>.

THE NATURE OF LIFE

- 1. We are created in the of image God.
- We are a unique <u>reflection</u> of God, utterly <u>reliant</u> on God, and ultimately <u>responsible</u> to God.
- 2. We are created for the purpose of God.

THE NEED FOR SALVATION

- 1. Genesis 1-11 gives us glimpses of **Grace**: the promise of **Christ**
- 2. Genesis 1-11 compels us to counter **Culture**.
- We oppose abortion because it destroys the <u>Beauty</u> of human life, work to end slavery because it denies the <u>equality</u> of human life, and fight pornography because it denigrates the <u>dignity</u> of human life.

How does seeing God as Creator change our perspective on life? God as King? Judge? Savior?

How does being a unique reflection of God affect the way you view your own life?

How does acknowledging that all people are created in the image of God affect your view of issues related to human life like abortion? Sex trafficking? Sexual exploitation? Pornography?

David said, "The ultimate lie is that there are not eternal consequences for your sins." Explain what this means.

In Genesis 3 we see that sin first entered the world when God's words were questioned. In what ways do you question what God has said? Where does our culture tempt us to doubt God's good design and authority? How is blame still shifted?

How does the gospel compel action related to issues of human life?

How do issues of human life open a door to conversations about the gospel? Give examples of statements that relate the gospel to abortion, sexual exploitation, or pornography.
