SERMON NOTES:

When Jesus had finished saying all this to the people who were listening, he entered Capernaum. There a centurion's servant, whom his master valued highly, was sick and about to die. The centurion heard of Jesus and sent some elders of the Jews to him, asking him to come and heal his servant. When they came to Jesus, they pleaded earnestly with him, "This man deserves to have you do this, because he loves our nation and has built our synagogue."

So Jesus went with them.

Notes: 2. Centurion

A centurion would command a hundred men in the Roman army. The man in our story is a military leader. He is a soldier. He is a warrior. He leads men into war and conflict. Centurions formed the backbone of the Roman army. They had to prove themselves reliable and shown to hold their ground and willing to die at their posts. These were the elite, the best and finest men in the Roman army.
This centurion, a compassionate warrior, a man of noble character, is breaking down all sorts of class and ethnic and national barriers.
He was not far from the house when the centurion sent friends to say to him: "Lord, don't trouble yourself, for I do not deserve to have you come under my roof. That is why I did not even consider myself worthy to come to you. But say the word, and my servant will be healed." ~ Luke 7:6-7
Jesus is amazed by faith, and also by the lack of it. You are going to amaze Jesus one way or the other!

Notes: 3. Servant
The status of a servant in Roman society was that of a property. The servant was a tool. He had no rights. His master could abuse him and even kill him. When a slave was no longer of any use, they would be thrown out to die.
