 A <u>parable</u> is a story about a <u>familiar</u> topic to teach an important lesson

## Matthew 25:1-5

"At that time the kingdom of heaven will be like ten virgins who took their lamps and went out to meet the bridegroom. Five of them were foolish and five were wise. The foolish ones took their lamps but did not take any oil with them. The wise ones, however, took oil in jars along with their lamps. The bridegroom was a long time in coming, and they all became drowsy and fell asleep."

- At that time
  - No one knows the time (vs. 36)
  - Like in the days of <u>Noah</u> (vs. 37)
  - Two <u>men</u> in the <u>field</u> (vs. 40)
  - Two <u>women</u> at the <u>mill</u> (vs. 41)
  - o Like a <u>thief</u> in the <u>night</u> (vs. 42-44)
- <u>10</u> virgins who went out to meet the <u>bridegroom</u>
  - The bride is **chosen** (Jn. 15:16)
  - A price is **paid** (I Cor. 6:19-20)
  - The agreement is <u>sealed</u> (Matt. 26:27-28)
    - <u>Communion</u> is a reminder to us of the <u>New</u>
      <u>Covenant</u>
  - <u>Preparations</u> are made (Jn. 14:2-3)
  - The <u>call</u> for the wedding to begin (Matt. 24:36 & 1 Thess. 4:16-17)

- 5 **foolish** no **oil**
- 5 wise have oil
