HEART

HANDS

- * This week, identify one area in your life where you struggle with faithfulness. Commit to praying daily for God's help in cultivating faithfulness in that area.
- * Choose a Bible verse about God's faithfulness to memorize and meditate on throughout the week.
- * Reach out to someone who has been a model of faithfulness in γour life. Thank them and ask them to share their insights on remaining faithful.
- * Look for an opportunity to be faithful in a small task or commitment this week, even if it's inconvenient or challenging.
- * If γou're not currently discipling anyone, pray for God to bring someone into γour life whom γou can begin mentoring in the faith.



Day 1: God's Unwavering Faithfulness Reading: Hosea 11:1-11

Devotional: God's Unwavering Faithfulness Reading: Hosea 11:1-11 Devotional: God's faithfulness shines brightly against the backdrop of human unfaithfulness. In Hosea, we see a powerful metaphor of God as a loving father, heartbroken by His child's rebellion yet moved by compassion to forgive. Reflect on times when you've strayed from God. How has He remained faithful to you despite your shortcomings? Consider writing a prayer of gratitude for God's enduring love and commitment to you, even in your most unfaithful moments.

Day 2: The Fruit of Faithfulness Reading: Galatians 5:22-26

Devotional: aithfulness is a fruit of the Spirit, cultivated in us as we walk closely with God. It's not about perfection, but about allowing God to develop His character in us. Think about areas in your life where faithfulness is challenging - perhaps in relationships, work, or spiritual disciplines. How can you open yourself more fully to the Spirit's work in these areas? Ask God to help you recognize opportunities to practice faithfulness in small, everyday ways.

Day 3: Faithful to the End Reading: 2 Timothy 4:6-8

Devotional: Paul's powerful testimonγ of finishing the race and keeping the faith challenges us to persevere. Like John Calvin, who remained dedicated to his calling until his last breath, we're called to be faithful to the end. What does "finishing well" look like in your life? Identify one area where you feel tempted to give up or compromise. Pray for renewed strength and commitment in this area, asking God to help you run your race with endurance.

Day 4: God's Faithfulness in Suffering Reading: Lamentations 3:19-26

* Devotional: Even in our darkest moments, God's faithfulness remains. The author of Lamentations clings to hope in God's steadfast love amid terrible suffering. Reflect on a time of hardship in your life. How did you experience God's faithfulness during that time? If you're currently going through a difficult season, meditate on these verses and ask God to renew your hope in His unfailing compassion and faithfulness.



Day 5: Faithfulness in Our Calling Reading: 1 Corinthians 4:1-2

Devotional: We are called to be faithful stewards of God's mysteries. This applies not just to pastors or leaders, but to all believers in whatever roles and responsibilities God has given us. Consider your various roles - as a family member, in your work, in your community, or in the church. How can you demonstrate greater faithfulness in these areas? Ask God to show you one specific way you can be a more faithful steward of His grace today.
