Thank you to all who made a donation in honor or in memory of our moms this past Sunday. We will be sending the donation to Woman 2 Woman Pregnancy Resource Center. This organization helps moms facing an unplanned pregnancy. Many of the women who arrive at Woman 2 Woman are planning or considering an abortion. Woman 2 Woman helps them see their baby as more than a clump of cells. Through counseling and taking a sonogram, the women see their baby for what it is: a baby. Most women choose life for their baby once they see that they are carrying a human being in their body. At that point, Woman 2 Woman's work really begins. Being pro-life means more than just encouraging a pregnant woman to not have an abortion. This organization helps the mom make decisions about adoption or keeping the baby after birth. For those choosing adoption, the organization assists with working through that decision and helps with prenatal vitamins and self-care during the pregnancy. For those choosing to raise the baby, the organization has parenting classes and even helps the mom get prepared with the essential materials for raising the baby.

Our Season of Prayer is continuing. Are you keeping up with the devotionals? I know that having a daily time of prayer is a challenging habit for those not in the current practice of doing so. If you miss a day, make the commitment to get back on track. Write down the thoughts God is teaching you. Talk with your family about the experience of praying with your church every day. I am looking forward to hearing what God is teaching you during this time.

Saturday, May 7 marked the end of a months-long work for me. I believe in serving not just my Savior Jesus and his church. I believe in working for the good of the community. Battling the Enemy

Our church is in the middle of our focus on prayer. I know many of you are praying and working through it on your own, in your families, and with your CBS classes. Maybe, like me, you have been experiencing resistance or difficulties that have come up recently. I can say personally I have been dealing with sickness with myself and my boys as well as other distractions that have made many days difficult to take the time to do the devotion. Most of the time, this is just life and things we deal with and move on. However, the timing feels like this is more than coincidental.

<u>Ephesians 6:12</u> For we do not wrestle against flesh and blood, but against the rulers, against the authorities, against the cosmic powers over this present darkness, against the spiritual forces of evil in the heavenly places.

Prayer and obedience are our greatest weapons for spiritual warfare. We as a church and as individuals have initiated a battle against our common enemy simply by praying and focusing on God. It should come as no surprise that the enemy would fire back with the weapons he has at his disposal. I don't know what that has looked like for you, but for me it has been battle of busyness, sickness, and distraction. Those may be small in compared to what you have faced, but I see it all as a significant sign that we are assaulting the powers of darkness in our church and community through our prayer and focus on God's will for this church and community.

I simply want to encourage you to keep fighting, keep praying, and keep investing into your spiritual life and that of your family and friends. Our King is alive and on His throne. The war has already been won. We simply need not give up, and by His power and strength we will prevail against whatever spiritual attack you may be facing.

Romans 8:31-39 What then shall we say to these things? If God is for us, who can be against us? He who did not spare his own Son but gave him up for us all, how will he not also with him graciously give us all things? Who shall bring any charge against God's elect? It is God who justifies. Who is to condemn? Christ Jesus is the one who died—more than that, who was raised—who is at the right hand of God, who indeed is interceding for us. Who shall separate us from the love of Christ? Shall tribulation, or distress, or persecution, or famine, or nakedness, or danger, or sword? As it is written, "For your sake we are being killed all the day long; we are regarded as sheep to be slaughtered." No, in all these things we are more than conquerors through him who loved us. For I am sure that neither death nor life, nor angels nor rulers, nor things present nor things to come, nor powers, nor height nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord.
