## as you go

## family devotion

Consider following up with your student later in the week with the following summary and discussion questions.

## Summary: John 17:13-26

Before Jesus left the Last Supper with His disciples and went to the place where Judas would betray Him, He prayed for His disciples and for those who would follow Him because of them. That includes us! This is often called the "High Priestly Prayer," and in it, Jesus prayed that His followers would be one the way God is one. This isn't an easy thing for humans on this earth; we like to focus on our own comfort and desires. But the good news is that we don't have to do it on our own. We can trust that God's oneness will overflow to His people, and this points the world to Him.

## discussion questions

What does it mean that God is one? What does it mean for us to be one the way He is?

What do you think it means to be "sanctified" by the truth? How can you allow the Spirit of truth to do this work in you?

PRAY: Ask God to show you what unity looks like among His believers. Thank God that if we believe in Him and follow His commands, we are part of His family forever. Thank Him that we can experience supernatural oneness because He is with us.
