Read Luke 13: 34-35.

As far as I know the people have Sanger have never killed a prophet of God. In this passage Jesus lamented Jerusalem's history of failure to follow closely God's command to honor Him and love his people. Instead of seething with anger, Jesus demonstrated a broken heart for the people who were like sheep without a shepherd. He saw the broken spirit, loneliness and pain of the city and her people.

Take a moment to consider your feelings towards Sanger. Does your heart break for the people living without the hope of Jesus in their lives? If you read through the Sanger Speaker on Facebook, do you get angry at hurtful comments or do you grieve for the pain demonstrated through those comments?

Jesus has called FBC Sanger to make believers of unbelievers and disciples of believers. Jesus used the imagery of being fishers of men when calling Peter to be His disciple. To become fishers of men, we have to learn to love them as Jesus loves them. Ask God to give you a deep abiding love for Sanger and her people.
