01 What is something you just couldn't wait to tell other people about? Why did you want to share it with others so much?

family **DEVOTION**

Consider following up with your student later in the week with the following summary and discussion questions.

SUMMARY: MATTHEW 28:1-10,16-20

When astounding things happen to us, it can often be hard to keep it to ourselves. We want other people to know about it! Once we have seen, we can't help but tell. The women who went to the tomb on that first Easter morning experienced this in the biggest way. Once they saw the empty tomb, the angel instructed them to spread the news about what they had seen firsthand, and they did so joyfully. Each of us are called to do the same with the news of the resurrection: we come and see Jesus so that we can go and tell the good news.

01 Why do you think the angel told the women to spread the news about Jesus's resurrection rather than telling the disciples himself or letting Jesus do it?



How does the Great Commission apply to each of us? What are some ways it changes the way we live our day to day lives?

PRAY: Thank God that He includes us in His plans by asking us to spread the gospel throughout our communities, neighborhoods, states, countries, and around the globe.
