9 Love to Tell the Story

I love a good story, especially true stories. In fact, one of the great ways to get to know someone you've just met is to ask them to tell you something about themselves — their "story." The stories that they tell will usually reveal what they see as important about themselves.

As Christians, we should all have an important personal story to tell: that is, how the Gospel (the "good news" of Jesus) has intersected with our life story.

We know it is important to share the Gospel; we talk about it in church often. What does that mean? We need to be able to share the story of what God has done in our lives!

The first thing to understand about our story is our spiritual condition before the Gospel's intervention in our lives. People need to know that we have all sinned against God, and our sin separates us from him. God is holy, and sin cannot be in his presence. Being righteous and just, God must judge sin; he cannot just overlook it. Every single person is justly condemned in their own sins, deserving death and eternal separation from God. Further, there is nothing we can do to save ourselves. No amount of good works, or expressions of religion, philosophy, or morality can overcome the overwhelming impact of our sin against God.

That's where the Gospel comes in! The good news is that, while we were sinners, God loved us. Through his love, God provided a way for us to be saved from our sin and guilt. Jesus -- God in the flesh -- came to dwell among his creation. He lived the sinless and righteous life that we could never live, and then willingly died on a cross as a perfect sacrifice for our sins. He then rose from the grave on the third day, victorious over death forever. Jesus paid our debt! When we turn from our sin and come to him in faith, trusting in who he is and in his finished work for us, we are saved. We no longer trust in our own empty self righteousness; we place our trust in Jesus's righteousness given to us as a gift.

The Gospel forever changes our life story. We are no longer our own; we were bought with a price. We live to glorify him. (1 Cor. 6:20)

So, is the Gospel story a part of your personal story? If not, it can be today! Come to Christ and be saved! If the Gospel is part of our story, we need to tell it!
