These are simple questions to ask your student as you go home from church or go about your weekly activities.



.01 Have you ever hidden something you did because you were afraid or embarrassed, even though you thought it was the right thing to do?

Is there something happening in your life that you wish were finished? What is it? How will life be different when it is finished?

family **DEVOTION**

Consider following up with your student later in the week with the following summary and discussion questions.

SUMMARY: JOHN 19:17-22,25-30,38-42

After suffering and being mocked relentlessly, Jesus finally reached the place where the cross would stand. He was crucified in between two others and left to die. However, as he hung there dying, He lovingly spoke down to His mother and one of His beloved disciples and instructed them to care for one another. Then, he died. Even though He died a criminal's death, some of His followers made sure His body was given the utmost respect. His enemies had gotten their way for now, but even as He was being buried, He showed that He had a lasting impact on the lives of those who followed Him.

discussion questions

.01 How do these passages show the different ways that Jesus had an impact on those around Him? What can this teach us about His kingdom?



.02 How can you show Jesus the honor and glory He deserves, even in times of sadness or anxiety?

PRAY: Praise Jesus that even in His moments of suffering, He had compassion on His followers. Pray that His example would help you to grow in faith and godliness.
