HOLY Spirit 101

Main Scripture Passages: John 14:16-17, 26; 16:5-15

In this session we will explore the foundational doctrine of the Holy Spirit, focusing attention on what Jesus himself said to expect regarding the Spirit. We will look at who the Holy Spirit is, what he does, and what it means for the believer to be indwelt by him.

The Holy Spirit is...

GOD - OMNISCIENT, ETERNAL, ALL-POWERFUL

Matthew 28:19; Luke 1:35; John 16:13; Act 5:3-4; 1 Corinthians 2:10-11; 3:16-17; 12:4-6; 2 Corinthians 13:14; Hebrews 9:14

PERSONAL - NOT AN IMPERSONAL FORCE

Has personal pronouns (John 16:13-14), Another "of the same kind" as Christ (John 16:7), Referred to as a member of the Trinity (Matthew 3:16-17, 28:19; Acts 2:33, 38; 2 Corinthians 13:14; 1 Peter 1:2), Can interact with him (Matthew 12:31; Mark 3:29; John 14:26; Acts 5:3-4; 7:51; 15:28; Ephesians 4:30; 1 Thessalonians 5:19)

RESPONSIBLE FOR SPIRITUAL WORKS

Creation (Genesis 1:2; Job 26:13), Cultivating justice, peace, righteousness and devotion (Isaiah 32:15; 44:3-5), Equipping God's people (Exodus 35:31-35; Zechariah 4:6; Romans 12:6-8; 1 Corinthians 12:4-11; Ephesians 4:11-13; 1 Peter 4:10-11) Interceding for believers (Romans 8:26-27), Giving Scripture (2 Timothy 3:16; 2 Peter 1:21), Providing conviction (John 3:5-8; 16:8), Regenerating human hearts (Ezekiel 36:26-28; John 16:8-11; Romans 8:11; Titus 3:5), Sanctifying the believer (Romans 8:1-17), Producing fruit in and through the believer (Galatians 6:5:22-23)

Discussion - Holy Spirit 101

Gather together with your small group and turn your attention to the following discussion questions:

1.	What new characteristic of the Holy Spirit did you learn about tonight, or which characteristic did you understand in a deeper way?
2.	Jesus said that it was better for him to leave than to stay with us, because that would enable him to send us the Spirit. How is having the Holy Spirit present within us better even than having Christ beside us?
3.	How can we as believers cultivate awe and wonder for the astounding truth that the Spirit of the Living God lives within us?
4.	Describe what impact consistent awareness of the Holy Spirit within you might have on your personal life and faith development.
5.	What remaining questions do you have about the Holy Spirit?

Main Session Two Teaching Notes:

Discussion — The Holy Spirit & The Believer

- 4. Do you find yourself paying more attention to the Holy Spirit's comfort or conviction? How can you assist yourself in finding a balance between the two?
- 5. How is the concept of "now-and-not-yet" relevant to Christian faith? How does it relate to the work of the Holy Spirit in your life?
