## Read Psalm 96

- What stood out to you from Sunday's sermon?
- What challenged you?
- Have you given much thought to the people groups in the world who are unreached with the gospel? Were the statistics of unreached people in the world new to you?
- How can our worship and prayer make a difference in global missions?
- Consider the quote by <u>John Piper:</u>

Worship is the goal and the fuel of missions: Missions exists because worship doesn't. Missions is our way of saying: the joy of knowing Christ is not a private, or tribal, or national or ethnic privilege. It is for all. And that's why we go. Because we have tasted the joy of worshiping Jesus, and we want all the families of the earth included. Seeking the worship of the nations is fueled by the joy of our own worship. You can't commend what you don't cherish. You can't proclaim what you don't prize. Worship is the fuel and the goal of missions.
