### **Sermon Notes and Outline**

Main Point: God responded to our sin by becoming one of us, living among us and dying for us.

The Incarnation, suffering, death and resurrection of Jesus accomplished 4 things:

1. Destroyed the power of death held by the devil. Vs. 14
2. Delivered us from the controlling fear of death. Vs. 15
3. Made us right with God through the forgiveness of sins. Vs. 17
4. Helps us in our temptations. Vs. 16, 18

Incarnation - The act whereby the eternal Son of God, the Second Person of the Holy Trinity, without ceasing to be what He is, God the Son, took into union with Himself what He before that act did not possess, a human nature, "and so He was and continues to be God and man in two distinct natures and one person, forever." – Evangical Dictionary of Theology (Quoting part of the Westminster shorter catechism)

### **R Group Questions**

- What were your initial observations or thoughts from Sunday's sermon?

- Contrast how God DID respond to our sin with how He COULD HAVE responded to our sin.
