 - c. Shouldn't a love relationship with the Lord involved strong feelings of contentment, conviction and even passion?
 - d. If you side more on being emotionless in your walk with the Lord what can you do about that?
 - i. Read the Psalms and look for passion and emotion.
 - e. Are you more prone to make decisions based on feelings and/or intuition or more out of objectivity?
 - f. Are you out of balance when it comes to feeling and doing kingdom work?
 - g. Is God emotional? What emotions are described as the Lord's in the Bible?
 - h. What is the difference between emotions and emotionalism?
 - i. A great many casualties took place because of one man's sin (Absalom).
 - i. How has, or how is, your sin affecting others in your life.
 - ii. What do you need to do if this is the case?
 - j. Where do you see yourself in 2 Samuel 18-what needs to be applied?
