## **SMALL GROUP QUESTIONS**

Warm Up Question: What was something you gave your whole heart to for a season, and why did you do it?

Then notice verse 12, 15 and 23. Why is Paul giving up his rights? Why

is it important to define the whole gospel in three ways?

The Impact of the cross (The death and resurrection)

• The effect of the cross (Galatians 2:20 a gospel lifestyle)
