Jesus BC: New Spirit, Old Sin? Romans 7-8

- (1) The Old Testament promised that through the Messiah, God would pour out His Spirit and give His people new hearts.
 - ❖ Deuteronomy 30:6; Isaiah 59:20-21; Jeremiah 31:31-34; Ezekiel 36:26-28; Zechariah 12:10-13:2; Joel 2:28-30.
 - This promise was a big deal for two reasons
 - The Israelite were always straying from God.
 - With God's Spirit, people became amazing warriors, inspired prophets, skilled artists, and wise sages.
- (2) This promise was fulfilled in Acts 2. Christians were baptized in the Spirit.
 - They spoke in other languages, proclaimed the gospel boldly, did miracles, and had supernatural love and wisdom.
 - And yet, the early church was very far from perfect.
 - Non-Christian Jews argued that if Christians really had the Holy Spirit, they would obey God's law perfectly.
- (3) In Romans 7-8, Paul explains why Spirit-filled people are not perfect. By the Spirit we delight in God's law and want to please Him. But we are still trapped in bodies inclined toward sin. We have not yet received our glorified resurrection bodies. As a result, we are not righteous under the law, even with the Spirit. However, there is no condemnation for those in Christ Jesus because He took our punishment and gave us his righteousness. Even though we are not perfect, when we fix our mind on what God's Spirit desires, we will see growth and produce good fruit. And we can overcome sinful habits by trusting that God's ways are for our joy.
