Luke 1:5 – Birth of Hope

- (1) Luke uses the style of the Greek translation of the Old Testament
 - To show this is a continuation of the biblical story.
 - Not a new religion.
- (2) Unanswered prayer does not prove divine judgement or lack of concern.
 - God's timing and ways often surprise us.
 - ❖ Keep trusting and praying. Don't give up!
- (3) John will be filled with the Holy Spirit from the womb.
 - Which clearly implies he was a human being in the womb
 - Therefore, abortion is killing innocent human life.
- (4) John's calling was to prepare people for God's coming.
 - . By turning the hearts of fathers to their children.
 - When fathers disciple their children well, it prepares the way for God to work in their lives.
- (5) You can question God's voice, but not His power.
 - It's a good idea to test whether you heard God.
 - But it is wrong to doubt God's power.
 - Many Christians have absorbed the cynicism of secular culture and do not expect God to do anything miraculous in their lives.
- (6) Yet God is still merciful on those who doubt
 - ❖ God's discipline helped Zechariah and Elizabeth to worship Him.
