Questions from January 25, 2026

## (1) He Changes Your View of What is Possible.

- ❖ He wants to supernaturally multiply your effort.
- ❖ Obedience → Miracles → Revelation → Greater Obedience.
- ❖ God is not only able to heal, He is willing.
- ❖ Imitate Jesus. The 3 main components of Jesus' ministry were:
  - Sharing the good news, healing, and praying in private.
  - The Kingdom of God is not a matter of talk but of power.

## (2) He Changes Your View of God & Yourself

- a. When you really see Jesus, you realize that:
  - He is not merely "master;" he is "Lord."
  - You are more sinful than you believed,
    - But more loved than you imagined.
  - Forgiveness is not earned; it is received through Christ.
  - Jesus doesn't call the equipped. He equips the called.
  - It's not about being good. It's about being God's.
- b. Your primary identity comes from being Jesus' disciple.
  - Learning his teachings, living them out, and passing them on, becomes the goal of your life. All else is left behind.

## (3) He Changes Your View of Others

- ❖ He longs to heal the "unclean," give them a testimony, and bring them into God's family.
- ❖ We must fish for people, not stay in our comfort zone.

## Digging Deeper

- (2) Read Leviticus 25:8-22 and Luke 4:18-21. What are the similarities and differences between the literal year of Jubilee in Leviticus, and the Prophetic year of Jubilee (from Isaiah) that Jesus uses as the outline for his ministry?

## Living Out

- (3) Read 1 Corinthians 4:20. Why do Christians often spend far more time talking *about* God's power than showing it?
- (4) Read Luke 5:1-11 and Point 1. Explain the pattern below:  
Uncomfortable Obedience → Miracles → Revelation → Greater Obedience
- (5) Read Luke 5:8-11 and Point 2. Explain how a greater revelation of Jesus changes our view of ourselves.
- (6) Read Luke 4:42-44, 5:11, Point 2b and Point 3. Explain why being Jesus' disciple means we can't just stay in our comfortable circle of Christian family and friends. Who are some of the "unclean" that God wants you to fish for and that He wants to touch?
- (7) Read Luke 5:12-16. When it comes to showing the power of God by praying for the sick, why must we believe that God is both able and willing to heal? Why is regular, private prayer important?
