Luke 2.1-21 – Christ the Lord

(1) Real History

- Caeser Augustus issued a census of the Roman world.
- Quirinius ruled Syria and everyone went home to register.

(2) Controlled by God's Sovereignty

- Caesar made a decision of his own free will.
- ❖ Yet, it happened according to God's plan.
 - > Politics sets the stage, but is not the main event.

(3) To Save the Humble

- God reveals himself to the humble and lowly.
 - > And uses them to spread the message.
- ❖ To exalt God's grace and power, and test the "wise."

(4) By Sending Jesus

- Jesus came as Savior, to save us from evil and sin.
- Jesus came as Messiah to be our perfect King.
- ❖ Jesus came as the Lord. The Lord is God. Jesus is God.

(5) For Our Joy

- Jesus is good news that leads to great joy.
 - > For everyone who receives God's grace.
- ❖ As we ponder and treasure what God has done.
