
#### Faith by the Numbers

## Message Notes

"Give me a place to stand, and I shall move the earth."

- Archimedes, 287-212 bce

I believe in God because of \_\_\_\_\_!

"No one has ever seen God. God the only Son, who is at the Father's side, has made God known." - John 1:18

The historical argument for the resurrection of Jesus:

1. The earliest Christians believed in the bodily resurrection of Jesus.

Side note, the resurrection stories are strange:

- not religiously necessary
- unprecedented resurrection (transformational)
- prominence of women
- no interpretation to believers' future fates.
- The **empty tomb** and the **appearances** are \_\_\_\_\_\_

  and sufficient conditions of this belief.
- 3. The simplest explanation for the rise of this belief is the bodily resurrection of Jesus, to the shock of both ancient and modern sensibilities.

Alternative explanations:

- "Cognitive Dissonance"
  - assumes early Christians desired resurrection
  - does not account for empty tomb
- "Experience of Faith"
  - does not explain the origin of the experience
  - assumes an anachronistic view of body/soul
  - assumes the story was later developed

For early Christians, the resurrection of Jesus reinterpreted everything: nationalism, messiah, heaven, hope, and even God.

Continue the conversation:

- What information stirred you, today?
- How can we be *christocentric* and listen to how God is working through other peoples, traditions, and faiths?
- What ideas, for you, need to reinterpreted through the resurrection?

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
