### SERIES INSIGHT

3. How does prioritizing "honoring one another above yourselves" challenge our cultural norms and individualistic tendencies? How can we cultivate this mindset within our communities?
4. In what ways can we demonstrate genuine affection to others without hypocrisy, as instructed in Romans 12:10? How does this contribute to building stronger relationships within the body of Christ?
5. Reflecting on Romans 12:10, what are some practical steps we can take to foster unity and mutual respect within our church or small group, especially in the midst of differences and disagreements?

Allow people to share requests and celebrate any praise reports as well. Consider having someone write down the requests to share with the group. Take time to pray however long your group needs.
