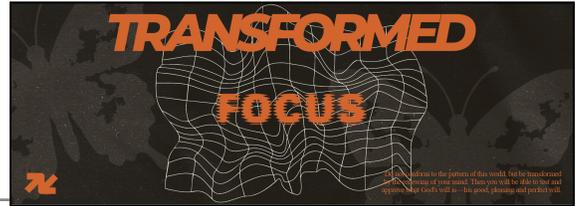


WEEK 10 | TRANSFORMED

Verses: Romans 12:13



SERIES INSIGHT

We're kicking off the New Year with our new series: **Transformed!** This is a 12 week series walking through Romans chapter 12. Our heart is to rise up to the challenge of being transformed in every sphere of our lives.

ICEBREAKER

- Would you rather be able to fly or be invisible?
- You have your own late night talk show, who do you invite as your first guest?

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

1. **Review the Message.** Looking back at your notes and upon reflecting on this weekend's message, what was your one takeaway from Sunday?
2. What is the difference between giving from your excess and sharing in someone's need? When was the last time helping someone actually cost you something (time, money, comfort, or convenience)?
 - a. **Life Application:** Where might God be inviting you to step into someone's need this week?
3. The command to "practice hospitality" literally means "pursue loving strangers." Is your life structured in a way that makes hospitality possible, or is it so busy and private that people rarely enter your space?
 - a. **Life Application:** What would it look like to make your home, table, or schedule more open to people?
4. In the early church, hospitality was not an event—it was a lifestyle. Do you see hospitality as hosting occasionally, or as a regular rhythm of life? What would change if your home became a place of ministry instead of just a place of privacy?
 - a. **Life Application:** What is one practical step you could take this month to make hospitality part of your normal rhythm?
5. Often the hardest part of Romans 12:13 is simply noticing the needs around us. Why do you think it's easy to miss or overlook the needs of people in our church or community? What helps you become more aware and attentive?
 - a. **Life Application:** Who around you right now might be quietly struggling that God could be calling you to help?
6. Romans 12 flows out of the Gospel in Romans 1–11—we give and welcome others because Christ first welcomed us. How does remembering that God welcomed us when we were spiritually poor and strangers change the way we think about generosity and hospitality?
 - a. **Life Application:** How can the Gospel shape the way you use your resources, home, and time for others this week?
