Date: November 20, 2022 Series: *Thanks-Prayer!* Title: *Thanking God Who is Good All the Time* Text: Hebrews 12:28 Preacher: Mark Adams

David Seamands tells the story of a Pastor named William Stidger---who lived back in the very early thirties during those hard years we refer to as The Great Depression. One day Stidger was seated with a group of friends in a restaurant. Everyone was talking about the depression: how terrible it was, the suffering people, rich people committing suicide, the jobless, the whole thing.

The conversation got more and more miserable as it went on. One of the ministers in the group, suddenly broke in and said, *"I don't know what I'm going to do, because in two or three weeks I have to preach a sermon on Thanksgiving Day. I want to say something affirmative. What can I say that's affirmative in a period of world depression like this?"* 

And as the minister spoke, Stidger said it was like the Spirit of God spoke to him: "Why don't you give thanks to those people who have been a blessing in your life and affirm them during this terrible time?"

He began to think about that. The thought came to his mind of a schoolteacher very dear to him, a wonderful teacher of poetry and English literature from years ago---who had gone out of her way to put a great love of literature and verse in him. It affected all his writings and his preaching. So, he sat down and wrote a letter to this woman, now up in years. It was only a matter of days until he got a reply in the feeble scrawl of the aged.

"My Dear Willy"--Stidger says at that time he was about 50 years of age and was bald, and no one had called him Willy for a long time--so just the opening sentence warmed his heart. Here's the letter:

"My Dear Willy: I can't tell you how much your note meant to me. I am in my eighties, living alone in a small room, cooking my own meals, lonely, and like the last leaf of autumn lingering behind. You'll be interested to know that I taught in school for more than fifty years, and yours is the first note of appreciation I ever received. It came on a blue, cold morning, and it cheered me as nothing has done in many years."

Stidger says, "I'm not sentimental, but I found myself weeping over that note." Then he thought of a kindly bishop, now retired, an old man who had recently faced the death of his wife and was all alone. This bishop had taken a lot of time, given him advice and counsel and love when he first began his ministry. So, he sat down and wrote the old bishop. In two days a reply came back.

"My Dear Will: Your letter was so beautiful, so real, that as I sat reading it in my study, tears fell from my eyes, tears of gratitude. Before I realized what I was doing, I rose from my chair and I called my wife to share it with her, forgetting she was gone. You'll never know how much your letter has warmed my spirit. I have been walking around in the glow of your letter all day long."

For nearly 25 years now, here at Redland we have acknowledged the importance and power---of thanking God---in good times and in bad times because as that first minister forgot---we know---we have experienced the fact that God is good---ALL THE TIME. That is why we have always set aside---the Sunday before Thanksgiving as a service of prayer.

And this year---just as He has done every year---God has given us much to thank Him for.

I am thankful for the numerous examples of a healthy church body at work that I have seen. I'm thinking of the things Trunk or Treat, the growth of our men's ministry under the leadership of Tom Cox. I'm thankful for all the dedicated Redlanders who worked to help our Afghan families get to doctor appointments, and immigration attorney meetings---Redlanders who bravely taught Parwana to drive---and get her license---and help them find a new home in Woodbridge, VA. I'm thankful for all the amazing, hard-working Redlanders who worked to make last week's Amani sale a success. It was wonderful having an Executive Employee at Amani---our own Cathie Burke---working with us again this year.

I'm thankful for our American Heritage Girls who worked hard to clean out our prayer garden. I'm thankful for the healing of our church we have seen this past year as more Grace Groups came back in the wake of Covid. Another example we enjoyed last week as our Gospel Choir, Kids for Praise, and Grace Notes Bells led in worship for the first time since the pandemic.

I'm thankful for the additions to our church we have had this last year: 27---12 people making their profession of faith and 15 Christians moving their membership here. I consider that wonderful for a post-pandemic year.

I'm thankful for the way we continue to see the ROC do what we felt God telling us it would do: "Give families what they want in order to give them what they need---Jesus." I'm thankful for Kenn and his crew and the many hours of work they have already put in before Upward season actually begins. Their labors are one reason we have 500 kids enrolled---and 100 of those players represent families who have no church home. I'm thankful that the mortgage for the ROC is paid in full. I'm thankful for my new UPWARD team---we are the Golden Eagles and two of my kids do not have a church home.

Well, I could go on and on, but suffice it to say that GOD IS GOOD ALL THE TIME and, as He has been in the past, this year---2022 He has once again been VERY good to this church! Our loving Heavenly Father continues to shower His blessings on us.

Hebrews 12:28 encourages us to: *"be thankful and so WORSHIP God acceptably with reverence and awe."* Hence the need for a service like this. At my request five individuals or couples have prepared prayers for this purpose. They are going to come one at a time to share them. Bill will lead us in a song of thanks between each prayer.

So, let's get started. Let's enter a time of conversational prayer---a time of communicating together with God---eyes and ears open---as we hear these prayers of thanks and then later, offer our own.
