Title: "A Service of Thanksgiving and Praise"

Series: "Thanks Prayer"

Let's begin by saying our text together. It's the same verse we saw in the video at the beginning of the service, 1 Chronicles 16:34:

"Give thanks to the Lord, for He is good; His love endures forever."

As you may or may not know, Mike and Mary Ann Moore have two amazing daughters. Emily, their oldest is about to finish med school at Vanderbilt in Nashville and Erin will graduate in a couple weeks from the University of Virginia with a master's degree in Speech-Language Pathology. Erin is winding up her masters by working in Outpatient Rehab at Wake Forest Baptist Hospital in Winston-Salem. This week Erin shared an experience that I felt led to share. She writes:

"One of my stroke patients has pretty severe Broca's aphasia, which means he can understand some of what you say but is largely unable to speak. He knows what he wants to say, but the words don't come out, so he mostly communicates through gestures or drawing. He is really good at saying single words when I give him a cue, and we have been practicing saying short functional phrases through something called "script training;" phrases like "I need to use the bathroom" or "I'm thirsty." He can't initiate saying any of these phrases but he's learning to do so when I cue him. When a person has a stroke, even if volitional speech is non-existent, sometimes automatic speech; like saying the days of the week, counting to 10, yelling certain words when you stub your toe, things like that are still intact. For this man, his automatic speech is pretty good once he has a cue to get started. For example, if I say 'one' he can then count to 10 with no help. Anyway, his brother messaged us and said he thinks it would be cool if he could learn to say the Thanksgiving blessing this year. So, our session today and parts of our other sessions before Thanksgiving will focus on script training him to say this simple prayer:

"God is great, God is good, Let us thank Him for our food."

When he came into our next session, I asked him about if he had practiced the prayer. He nodded yes and was able to say the entire thing with zero cues from me, which is huge for this man. It also proves that this blessing was said a lot in this man's house as he grew up. This underscores the importance of teaching our children to be thankful and the value of repeated prayers. I think it's really cool that I get to teach someone how to say a blessing for my job."

I agree! Erin is experiencing the joy that comes from joining God in His work! I also want to "amen" what Erin says about the importance of teaching our children to be thankful. Of course, we older people need to be reminded of that as well. This is one reason it is our custom here at Redland on the Sunday before Thanksgiving to spend our sermon time thanking God for the blessings of the past year. And as I look back over 2019 there are several things I am thankful for.

For example:

- We had another great summer of children's camps.
 In fact, AAKP camp was once again full to capacity and those kids blessed us with an amazing closing show; more of a worship service in my book! RBC Camp was full once again as well and this year we had seven children make first time professions of faith in Jesus---with another 8 saying they wanted to talk more about making this all-important decision.
- We had 26 people join our church this past year---most of them are already involved in ministry.
- Grace in Store opened this year--- and at this point has had nearly \$18,000 in sales.

10% of that goes into our Deacon Benevolence fund and every month 20% goes to a local charity like the Stepping Stones Shelter, the Manna Food Bank, our Crisis Pregnancy Centers and this month it was given to Mercy Chefs. By the way, I get notes every month from these people thanking us for helping them minister to needy people. But my favorite part of the Grace in Store success story are the conversations it makes possible with our neighbors. Every Wednesday Sue comes home as excited as the disciples were when they returned from the first mission trip. She recounts all the conversations she had with people and the way God is using that store to bless others. People have attended worship here because of those conversations.

Lost people have heard to Gospel because of them.

- I am thankful for our new Deacon Prayer Chapel Ministry. CC has taken this on to his already long list of jobs he does at Redland---and makes sure we have people in our prayer chapel praying for our church during every worship service.
- I'm thankful for the wonderful idea Alyson Owers had to move ESL to Wednesday nights so that the children of our students could attend graded choirs and bells. We have lots of new ESL workers this year and some of their students have brought their children to choir and have attended our worship services---people who don't know Jesus!
- I'm thankful for VERY successful mission trips to Puerto Rico and to Ocean City this year.

it feels so good to be on a team like we have now.

- I'm thankful for a new record in Upward basketball enrollment. Kenn tells me we have 370 kids this year! My team is the "Panthers" and even though I haven't met them yet---I'm sure they are GRRRREAT!
- I'm thankful for an increased number of Redlanders involved in AWANA leadership! Way to God Peggy!
- I'm thankful for this year's Trunk or Treat---one of the best ever. In fact, it was just plain incredible!
- I'm thankful for our staff.

 They are incredibly gifted---yet incredibly humble. They go the extra mile every week. We love the

 Lord and we love one another. We work together so well! I've been on staffs where this was not true---
- And as I look back over the past year and all the funerals we've done---the services in which we said good-bye to dear people like:
 - Alicia Taylor and Charlie Brinkman and Jack Powell, Paul Purcell and Verk Eubanks and Rich Collins-well those services make me praise God for the fact that Jesus rose on the third day and conquered death for us. This means all our "good-byes" are temporary. A day will dawn when we will all be together again. Death has lost its sting---thanks to Jesus.

Well, I could go on and on, but suffice it to say that GOD IS GOOD ALL THE TIME and, as He has been in the past, in 2019 He has once again been VERY good to this church! Our loving Heavenly Father continues to shower His blessings on us. Hebrews 12:28 encourages us to: "be thankful and so WORSHIP God acceptably with reverence and awe..." hence the need for a service like this. At my request FIVE individuals or couples have prepared prayers for this purpose. So, let us now enter a time of conversational prayer, a time of communicating together with God, eyes and ears open, as we hear these prayers of thanks and offer our own. They will come to you in the order that they are printed in the bulletin. Between each prayer we will sing and then after these prayers we will pause to give us all a chance to offer our own thanks to God for His great faithfulness.
