Chapter 7

God can turn an evil plan around.

- Chapter 6 concludes with this statement. “If Mordecai, before whom you have begun to fall, is of the Jewish people, you will not overcome him but will surely fall before him.” It appears that Zeresh, Haman’s wife, and his wise men understood the power of the God of Mordecai.
- Chapter 7 begins with the king and Haman joining Esther at the feast.
- Chapter 7:2, After the king inquired for the third time what Esther’s request was, she finally told him.
- Chapter 7:4, For we have been sold, I and my people, to be destroyed, to be killed, and to be annihilated.
- Chapter 7:5-6, “Who is he, and where is he, who dared to do this?” And Esther said, “A foe and enemy! This wicked Haman!”
- What appeared to be Haman’s victory became his downfall, and what looked like certain destruction for God’s people became the beginning of their deliverance.
- Points to consider.
 - A-** Esther risked her life to save others.
 - B-** God’s people must speak truth.
 - C-** God has a way of bringing things hidden into light. What looked like Haman’s victory turned out to be God’s judgement.
 - D-** God is still on his throne, even when circumstances seem hopeless. Gal. 6-7 Do not be deceived: God is not mocked, for whatsoever one sows, that will he reap.
 - E-** God has a plan and a purpose for your life. As hard as Satan may try, God’s plan will succeed.
