Daniel 3 NASB 3Nebuchadnezzar the king made an <b>image</b> of gold, the height of which was sixty cubits and its width six cubits; he set it up on the plain of Dura in the province of Babylon. <sup>2</sup> Then Nebuchadnezzar the king send word to assemble the satraps, the prefects and the governors, the counselors, the treasurers, the judges, the magistrates and all the rulers of the provinces to come to the dedication of the <b>image</b> that Nebuchadnezzar the king had set up.	notes

Then the satraops, the prefects and the governors, the counselors, the treasurers, the judges, the magistrates and all the rulers of the provinces were assembled for the dedication of the <b>image</b> that Nebuchadnezzar the king had set up; and they stood before the <b>image</b> that Nebuchadnezzar had set up. 4Then the herald loudly proclaimed: "To you the command is given, O peoples, nations and men of every language, 5that at the moment you hear the sound of the horn, flute, lyre, trigon, psaltery, bagpipe and all kinds of music, you are to fall down and <b>worship</b> the golden <b>image</b> that Nebuchadnezzar the king has set up. 6But whoever does not fall down and <b>worship</b> shall immediately be cast into the midst of a furnace of blazing fire."	
A counterfeit kingdom.	
<sup>7</sup> Therefore at that time, when all the peoples heard the sound of the horn, flute, lyre, trigon, psaltery, bagpipe and all kinds of music, all the peoples, nations and men of every language fell down and <b>worshiped</b> the golden <b>image</b> that Nebuchadnezzar the king had set up.

<sup>13</sup> Then Nebuchadnezzar in rage and anger gave orders to bring Shadrach, Meshach and Abed-	
nego; then these men were brought before the king. <sup>14</sup> Nebuchadnezar responded and said to	
them, "Is it true, Shadrach, Meshach and Abed-	
nego, that you dod not serve my gods or worship the golden image that I have set up? 15 now if you	
are ready, at the moment you hear the sound of the horn, flute, lyre, trigon, psaltery and bagpipe	
and all kinds of music, to fall down and worship	
the image that I have made, very well. But if you do not worship, you will immediately be cast	
into the midst of a furnace of blazing fire; and what god is there who can deliver you out of my hands?

<sup>4</sup> "You shall not make for yourself and idol or	
any likeness of what is in heaven above or on the earth beneath or in the water under the	
earth. ⁵You shall not worship them or serve them; for I, the Lord your God, am a jealous	
God, visiting the iniquity of the fathers on the children, on the third and the fourth	
generations of those who hate Me.	
<sup>16</sup> Shadrach, Meshach and Abed-nego replied to	
the king, "O Nebuchadnezzar, we do not need to give you an answer concerning this matter. <sup>17</sup> If it	
be so, our God whom we serve is able to deliver us from the furnace of blazing fire; and He will	
deliver us out of your hand, O king. <sup>18</sup> But even if He does not, let it be known to you, O king, that	
we are not going to serve your gods or <b>worship</b>	
the golden <b>image</b> that you have set up."	
If your goal is comfort and ease, you will end up eventually denying God.	

<sup>19</sup> Then Nebuchadnezzar was filled with wrath, and his facial expression was altered toward Shadrach, Meshach and Abed-Nego. He answered by giving orders to heat the furnace seven times more than it was usually heated. <sup>20</sup> He commanded certain valiant warriors who were in his army to tie up Shadrach, Meshach and Abed-nego in order to cast them into the furnace of blazing fire.	notes
<sup>21</sup> Then these men were tied up in their trousers, their coats, their caps and their other clothes, and were cast into the midst of the furnace of blazing fire. <sup>22</sup> For this reason, because the king's command was urgent and the furnace had been made extremely hot, the flame of the fire slew those men who carried up Shadrach, Meshach and Abed-nego. <sup>23</sup> But these three men, Shadrach, Meshach and Abed-nego, fell into the midst of the furnace of blazing fire still tied up.	
<sup>24</sup> Then Nebuchadnezzar the king was astounded and stood up in haste; He said to his high officials, "Was it not three men we cast bound into the midst of the fire?" They replied to the king, "Certainly, O king." <sup>25</sup> He said, "Look! I see four men loosed and walking about in the midst of the fire without harm, and the appearance of the fourth is like a son of the gods!" <sup>26</sup> Then Nebuchadnezzar came near to the door of the furnace of blazing fire; he responded and said, "Shadrach, MEshach and Abed-nego, come out, you servants of the Most High God, and come here!" Then Shadrach, Meshach and Abed-nego came out of the midst of the fire. <sup>27</sup> The atraps, the prefects, the governors and the king's high officials gathered around and saw in regard to these men that the fire had no effect on the bodies of these men nor was the hair of their head singed, nor were their trousers damaged, nor had the smell of fire even come upon them.

<sup>28</sup> Nebuchadnezzar responded and said, "Blessed be the God of Shadrach, Meshach and Abednego, who has sent His angel and delivered His servants who put their trust in Him, violating the king's command, and yielded up their bodies so as not to serve or <b>worship</b> any god except their own God. <sup>29</sup> Therefore I make a decree that any people, nation or tongue that speaks anything offensive against the God of Shadrach, Meshach and Abed-nego shall be torn limb from limb and their houses reduced to a rubbish heap, inasmuch as there is no other god who is able to deliver	

in this way." <sup>30</sup>Then the king caused Shadrach, Meshach and Abed-nego to prosper in the province of Babylon. V. 16-18 "O Nebuchadnezzar, we do not need to give you an answer concerning this matter. If it be so, our God whom we serve is able to deliver us from the furnace of blazing fire; and He will deliver us out of your hand, O king. 18 But even if He does not, let it be known to you, O king, that we are not going to serve your gods or worship the golden **image** that you have set up." "We are not going to serve your gods or worship the golden image."

**Group Discussion:** What is the largest statue you have seen in person?

**Read aloud:** Read Daniel 3, count how many times you see the words "image" and "worship."

- 1. Daniel 3:1 "Nebuchadnezzar the king made an **image** of gold" What images have we made in the 21 st century? How are we asked to bow to them? We have the obvious political agendas, but can you think of any others?
- 2. Daniel 3:4-5 "To you the command is given, O peoples, nations and men of every language, 5 that at the moment you hear the sound of the horn, flute, lyre, trigon, psaltery, bagpipe and all kinds of music, you are to fall down and **worship** the golden **image** that Nebuchadnezzar the king has set up." Why are the instruments and music mentioned? What role does music play in our lives? How is Babylon a counterfeit kingdom?
- 3. Daniel 3:16-18 "O Nebuchadnezzar, we do not need to give you an answer concerning this matter. <sup>17</sup>If it be so, our God whom we serve is able to deliver us from the furnace of blazing fire; and He will deliver us out of your hand, O king. <sup>18</sup>But even if He does not, let it be known to you, O king, that we are not going to serve your gods or **worship** the golden **image** that you have set up." Where do these three men find the courage to stand up to Babylon? Is courage something you decide or something you are given? Why did they not condemn everyone else? What does the statement show about the power of confession?
- 4. These three men chose to trust God even if he did not deliver them. Is there an area of your life right now where your trust is being tested? How do trials shape us? What's a trial you can remember that has helped perfect your faith?
