Jesus the Philosopher: Answers for Life Luke 19:28-44, September 8 & 11, 2022

Prayer Requests:

Group Discussion: How does spiritual blindness affect our faith?

Read out loud: Luke 19:28-44

Discuss - Who are you today? We can relate to everyone in this account at different times in our lives, however, who do you relate to now? How's your heart? Are you a disciple, the crowd, a religious leader, or spiritually blind?

Family Time: Read Luke 19:28-44 to your kids. Have the children explain what a king is. Explain that it is our job as Christians to glorify and exalt (lift up) Jesus, even when we don't understand.
