Luke 1:5-17 NASB

<sup>5</sup>In the days of Herod, king of Judea, there was a priest named Zechariah, of the division of Abijah; and he had a wife from the daughters of Aaron, and her name was Elizabeth. <sup>6</sup>They were both righteous in the sight of God, walking blamelessly in all the commandments and requirements of the Lord. <sup>7</sup>And yet they had no child, because Elizabeth was infertile, and they were both advanced in years.

Days of Herod – 400 years of silence Zechariah – God Remembers Elizabeth – God's Oath God remembers his oath. Flizabeth is barren.

<sup>8</sup>Now it happened that while he was performing his priestly service before God in the appointed order of his division, <sup>9</sup>according to the custom of the priestly office, he was chosen by lot to enter the temple of the Lord and burn incense. <sup>10</sup>And the whole multitude of the people were in prayer outside at the hour of the incense offering.

Zechariah is given a once in a lifetime opportunity. Incense offering symbolized the prayers of Israel ascending to God in a sweet aroma.

<sup>11</sup>Now an angel of the Lord appeared to him, standing to the right of the altar of incense. <sup>12</sup>Zechariah was troubled when he saw the angel, and fear gripped him. <sup>13</sup>But the angel said to him, "Do not be afraid, Zechariah, for your prayer has been heard, and your wife Elizabeth will bear you a son, and you shall name him John. <sup>14</sup>You will have joy and gladness, and many will rejoice over his birth. <sup>15</sup>For he will be great in the sight of the Lord; and he will drink no wine or liquor, and he will be filled with the Holy Spirit while still in his mother's womb. <sup>16</sup>And he will turn many of the sons of Israel back to the Lord their God.


<sup>17</sup> And it is he who will go as a forerunner before Him in the spirit and power of Elijah, to turn the hearts of fathers back to their children, and the disobedient to the attitude of the righteous, to make ready a people prepared for the Lord."	notes

- 1. Zechariah and Elizabeth were old in age and Elizabeth was barren. For them this was a huge disappointment in life, and they have probably come to terms with not having a child. What disappointments have you faced in life? It is tempting to worship God for what he can do for us and not who He is. Have you experienced this?
- 2. Zechariah continues to have faith despite living in a time of Roman oppression and discouragement from being childless. He has continued to pray and make his requests known to God. What role has faith played in your life in desolate times? Is it easier for you to have faith in extreme struggles or more difficult? Do you think we are in one of those difficult seasons as a society? What impossible situation are you praying for right now?
- 3. Zechariah has submitted his will to God's plan. He continues to perform his priestly duties, he is known as righteous and blameless. He has not conspired to bear a child another way or divorced Elizabeth. He has determined to trust God's plan. What areas of life have you had to make up your mind to submit your will or preference to God's Plan?
- 4. Part of John's mission is to turn the hearts of fathers back to their children, and the disobedient to the attitude of the righteous. Change starts in our homes. Do you see what happens in your home as part of the change we need in culture? What does that mean to turn the hearts of the father back to their children? Have we lost our focus when it comes to parenting our children? What struggles do you face as a parent or grandparent?

**Family Time:** Ask your children if they know what a forerunner is. Give examples of a forerunner in sports, technology, science, music etc. Then read Luke 1:5-25 and share about the forerunner John the Baptist and the important role he plays in story of Jesus.
