PART 24 NO RIVALS

The Starting Point for God's Covenant People (Exodus 20:3)

INTRODUCTION:

"You shall have no other gods before Me."

PREVIOUSLY...

You Are Mine! (Exodus 19:1-8)

- The Mountain (19:1-2), the Mediator (19:3), and the Message (19:4-6)
 - "You are Mine... for I have redeemed you."
 - The Law was never intended to be a way to life, but a way of life for those who have already been redeemed.

He Is Not Safe! (Exodus 19:9-25)

- Approaching the Unapproachable: On His Terms.
 - There is no approaching Yahweh without <u>consecration</u> (v. 10-11a), without <u>invitation</u> (v. 11b, 13b), without <u>limitation</u> (v. 12-13a), and without <u>trepidation</u> (v. 16).

All These Words! (Exodus 20:1-2)

- Disregard Them to Your Own Peril.
 - The <u>Covenant</u> Context: Covenants form the basis of God's <u>relationship</u> with His Creation and especially mankind, providing a <u>framework</u> for all of <u>history</u>.
 - The <u>Preamble</u>: (v.2) I am not giving you these commandments so that by <u>keeping</u>
 <u>them</u> you might <u>become</u> my people. I am giving you these commandments because
 you <u>are</u> my people.

"I am the LORD your God, who brought you out of the land of Egypt, out of the house of slavery."

 "These Words" are both <u>Foundational</u> and <u>Formational</u>. For the Decalogue is not merely the revelation of God's <u>commands</u>, but of His <u>character</u> — with the expectation of our <u>conformity</u>.
