"God's Reassuring Word for the Weak in Faith" (Genesis 18:1-15)

### 1A. ENTERTAINING ROYALTY: A SIMPLE ACT OF HOSPITALITY BECOMES A STRONG ASSURANCE OF HOPE.

"Let love of the brethren continue. Do not neglect to show hospitality to strangers, for by this some have entertained angels without knowing it."

- 1C. The \_\_\_\_\_\_\_ of the Unexpected Guests (v. 1, 2a) "Now <u>the LORD appeared to him</u> by the oaks of Mamre, while he was sitting at the tent door in the heat of the day. When he lifted up his eyes and looked, behold, <u>three men were standing opposite him</u>..."

The \_\_\_\_\_\_\_\_\_ shown the Unexpected Guests (v. 2b-8) "...he <u>ran</u> from the tent door to meet them and <u>bowed himself</u> to the earth, ...Abraham <u>hurried</u> into the tent to Sarah, and said, '<u>Quickly</u>, prepare...' Abraham also <u>ran</u> to the herd, and took a tender and choice calf and gave it to the servant, and <u>he hurried to prepare it</u>..."

#### 2A. GOD'S REASSURING WORD FOR THE WEAK IN FAITH: WHAT YOU CAN EXPECT WHEN GOD IS YOUR FRIEND

"Without becoming weak in faith he contemplated his own body, now as good as dead since he was about a hundred years old, and the deadness of Sarah's womb."

"By faith even Sarah herself received ability to conceive, even beyond the proper time of life, <u>since</u> she considered Him faithful who had promised."

1B. Sarah her unbelief. (v. 11, 12)

"And Sarah was listening at the tent door, which was behind him. Now Abraham and Sarah were old, advanced in age; Sarah was past childbearing. Sarah laughed to herself, saying, 'After I have become old, shall I have pleasure, my lord being old also?'"

2B. Sarah \_\_\_\_\_\_ her unbelief. (v. 15a)
