INTRODUCTION:

MARRIAGE AS GOD INTENDS:

- 1. MARRIAGE IS THE <u>PRODUCT</u> OF THE <u>CREATIVE WORK</u> OF GOD.
- 2. MARRIAGE IS TO BE <u>PATTERNED</u> AFTER THE <u>COVENANT FAITHFULNESS</u> OF GOD.
- 3. MARRIAGE HAS BEEN <u>PERVERTED</u> (LIKE EVERY OTHER RELATIONSHIP) BY THE <u>CORRUPTING PRESENCE</u> OF SIN.
- 4. MARRIAGE IS **POSSIBLE** THROUGH THE **CONSTRAINING LOVE** OF CHRIST.
- 5. MARRIAGE IS TO BE A <u>PICTURE</u> OF THE <u>OUINTESSENTIAL RELATIONSHIP</u> BETWEEN CHRIST AND THE CHURCH.

• DEFINITIONS: MARRIAGE IS AN <u>EXCLUSIVE</u>, <u>PERMANENT</u>, <u>ONE-FLESH</u> RELATIONSHIP BETWEEN A MAN AND A WOMAN WHICH IS <u>ESTABLISHED</u>, <u>GUARDED</u>, <u>GOVERNED</u> AND <u>GUIDED</u> BY A <u>COVENANT</u>.
