INTRODUCTION:

PREVIOUSLY, DOES YOUR FAITH HAVE A PULSE? (2:14-26)

"Even so faith, if it has no works, is dead, being by itself." (v. 17)

- IF... faith is <u>indispensable</u>, <u>irreplaceable</u> and eternally <u>consequential</u>,... and it is... THEN... James is burdened that his scattered congregation not only <u>profess</u> faith but actually <u>possess</u> genuine <u>saving</u> faith.
- And **Real Faith** is not only demonstrated by **faithfulness** in the **face** of **trial** and **testing** (1:2-13),... but also by **faithfulness** in the **form** of **sanctification** and **service** (2:14-26). Real faith **transforms** your life.
- Genuine faith is far more than a simple acknowledgment of God,... for it involves a life of active consecration that surrenders everything to Him.
