THE PROMISE KEEPING GOD

Hebrews 6:13-20

GOD IS A PROMISE KEEPER

- ""For when God made a promise to Abraham, since He had no one greater to swear by, He swore by Himself: 14 I will indeed bless you, and I will greatly multiply you. 15 And so, after waiting patiently, Abraham obtained the promise. 16 For people swear by something greater than themselves, and for them a confirming oath ends every dispute. 17 Because God wanted to show His unchangeable purpose even more clearly to the heirs of the promise, He guaranteed it with an oath," (Hebrews 6:13-17)
- "The Lord said to Abram: Go from your land, your relatives, and your father's house to the land that I will show you. 2 I will make you into a great nation, I will bless you, I will make your name great, and you will be a blessing. 3 I will bless those who bless you, I will curse anyone who treats you with contempt, and all the peoples on earth will be blessed through you." (Genesis 12:1-3)
- "Abram believed the Lord, and he credited it to him as righteousness." (Genesis 15:6)
- Affirming God as a Promise Keeper is foundational to our understanding of the character of God.
- The same way Abraham inherited his promised blessings, true Christians will inherit God's promises through Christ.
- Learning to "wait patiently" is how we endure until we receive our eternal inheritance.

GOD CANNOT LIE

- "<u>He guaranteed it with an oath</u>, 18 so that through two unchangeable things, in which <u>it is impossible for God to lie</u>, we who have fled for refuge might have strong encouragement <u>to seize the hope set before us</u>," (Hebrews 6:17b-18)
- We can trust in the reliability of God's promises because He has shown repeatedly that He is trustworthy in all He says and does.
- God went to tremendous lengths to help us establish confidence in His trustworthiness because of His deep love for us.
- "Because God wanted to show His unchangeable purpose even more clearly to the heirs of the promise..." (Hebrews 6:17a)

JESUS ENSURES OUR <u>SALVATION</u> IS <u>SECURE</u>

- "We have this hope as an anchor for the soul, <u>firm and secure</u>. It enters the inner sanctuary behind the curtain. 20 Jesus has entered there <u>on our behalf</u> as a forerunner, because <u>He has</u> <u>become a high priest forever</u> according to the order of Melchizedek." (Hebrews 6:20)
- There is no better person than Jesus to secure our salvation and guaranteed inheritance from God!
- We can find strength and encouragement in the fact that Jesus serves as our High Priest before our Heavenly Father.

CONNECT GROUP DISCUSSION

Observation

- What is the **primary** theme of Hebrews 6:13-20?
- What does it mean that God swore by Himself, and how does this relate to His unchangeable nature?
- How do the promises made to Abraham find their fulfillment in Christ?
- Why is belief in God's promises considered an act of righteousness (cf. Genesis 15:6)?

Understanding

- Are there areas in your life where you are struggling to trust God's timing? What would it look like to "wait patiently" like Abraham?
- What promises of God are you currently holding onto in your spiritual walk?
- How can a deeper trust in God's promises transform your response to hardship or uncertainty?
- Why is it significant to our faith that it is "impossible for God to lie"?
- How does knowing God cannot lie affect the way you read and apply Scripture?
- When you face uncertainty about your salvation, what truths from this passage can you cling to?
