

The Lord be with you. **And also with you.** 


Lift up your hearts.

Pastor continues leading the prayer, asking God to pour out God's Holy Spirit on us and this meal.


...Through your Son Jesus Christ, with the Holy Spirit in your holy church, all honor and glory are yours, almighty God, now and forever.

RECEIVING THE BREAD AND CUP



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
### **CLOSING PRAYER**


