THE GREAT THANKSGIVING

The Lord be with you. **And also with you.** Lift up your hearts. **We lift them up to the Lord.** Let us give thanks to the Lord our God. **It is right to give our thanks and praise.**

It is right, and a good and joyful thing, always and everywhere to give thanks to You, Father Almighty, Creator of heaven and earth. You formed us in Your image and breathed into us the breath of life. When we turned away, and our love failed, Your love remained steadfast. By baptism of His suffering, death, and resurrection, You gave birth to Your Church, delivered us from slavery to sin and death, and made with us a new covenant by water and the Spirit.

On the night in which He gave Himself up for us, He took bread, gave thanks to You, broke the bread, gave it to His disciples, and said: "Take, eat; this is My body which is given for you. Do this in remembrance of Me." When the supper was over, He took the cup, gave thanks to You, gave it to His disciples, and said: "Drink from this, all of you; this is My blood of the new covenant, poured out for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of Me."

KERNSTOWN UMC June 6, 2021 Text: Mark 3:20-35 Title: "SUBMIT"

20 Then Jesus entered a house, and again a crowd gathered, so that he and his disciples were not even able to eat. 21 When his family heard about this, they went to take charge of him, for they said, "He is out of his mind." 22 And the teachers of the law who came down from Jerusalem said, "He is possessed by Beelzebul! By the prince of demons he is driving out demons." 23 So Jesus called them over to him and began to speak to them in parables: "How can Satan drive out Satan? 24 If a kingdom is divided against itself, that kingdom cannot stand. 25 If a house is divided against itself, that house cannot stand. 25 If a house is divided against itself, that house cannot stand. 26 And if Satan opposes himself and is divided, he cannot stand; his end has come. 27 In fact, no one can enter a strong man's house without first tying him up. Then he can plunder the strong man's house. 28 Truly I tell you, people can be forgiven all their sins and every slander they utter, 29 but whoever blasphemes against the Holy Spirit will never be forgiven; they are guilty of an eternal sin." 30 He said this because they were saying, "He has an impure spirit."

31 Then Jesus' mother and brothers arrived. Standing outside, they sent someone in to call him. 32 A crowd was sitting around him, and they told him, "Your mother and brothers are outside looking for you." 33 "Who are my mother and my brothers?" he asked. 34 Then he looked at those seated in a circle around him and said, "Here are my mother and my brothers! 35 Whoever does God's will is my brother and sister and mother."

Introduction

[RAMP] What is your first thought when you hear the word "submit?" Is it a word that reminds you of peace, hope, and joy? Is it a word that conjures fear? When we submit to God, we are allowing God to have God's way in our lives. The truth is, we don't submit to God willingly. We must be forced to do so, and this is a work of grace and mercy by God in our lives.

[RELEVANCE] Key experiences during Jesus' ministry provide spiritual lessons for us to learn and incorporate in our lives.

[OUTCOME] In what area of your life is God calling you to submit to Him? Today we will see that Jesus was submitted to God the Father during His earthly ministry.

Body

Mark 1:14-6:29 provides us with Jesus' ministry to Galilee. It covers the first year and a half of Jesus' earthly ministry.

<u>What is happening in our text for today</u>? First, we see that such large crowds were following Him, and people were saying all sorts of things against Him. Jesus' own family tried to get Him under control, and they even said, "He is out of His mind."

Second, we see that the teachers of the law were saying terrible things about Him, "He has Beelzebul, and by the ruler of the demons he casts out demons." What does Jesus do? Jesus responds by speaking the truth, "How can Satan cast out Satan? 24 If a kingdom is divided against itself, that kingdom cannot stand. 25 And if a house is divided against itself, that house will not be able to stand. 26 And if Satan has risen up against himself and is divided, he cannot stand, but his end has come." Jesus takes the teachers of the law to seminary, and through simple logic shows the fallacy of their logic. But Jesus doesn't stop there, Jesus goes on to teach what is the unpardonable sin. Jesus says, "28 "Truly I tell you, people will be forgiven for their sins and whatever blasphemies they utter; 29 but whoever blasphemes against the Holy Spirit can never have forgiveness, but is guilty of an eternal sin"— 30 for they had said, "He has an unclean spirit." "Blasphemy means to slander God or give credit to something else that belongs to Him. Blasphemy against the Holy Spirit is this: "The malicious resistance against the Holy Spirit's converting power after one is shown that Jesus is the Christ." It is like a line in the sand.

Jesus taught about the unpardonable sin, because the Pharisees, teachers of the law, and all the religious leaders knew what the Scriptures taught. Jesus was doing exactly what the Scriptures taught. "They know the truth and are still choosing against God and are slandering God in the process!"ⁱ The Religious Leaders were committing the unpardonable sin.

Third, we see that Jesus followed the leading of the Holy Spirit and did the will of God the Father first. Nothing came second to this. Nothing. Mark 3:31-35 says, "31 Then Jesus' mother and brothers arrived. Standing outside, they sent someone in to call him. 32 A crowd was sitting around him, and they told him, "Your mother and brothers are outside looking for you." 33 "Who are my mother and my brothers?" he asked. 34 Then he looked at those seated in a circle around him and said, "Here are my mother and my brothers! 35 Whoever does God's will is my brother and sister and mother." These verses reveal to Whom Jesus gave His ultimate submission. The Person is God the Father.

Where do we see submission happening in this text? **First, we see submission of evil to God**. Jesus is God and has the ability to overcome evil in all of its forms, especially in the subtle form of false teaching from the religious leaders. Jesus overcomes evil with truth. Jesus told Pontius Pilot, when Jesus was being questioned by him, that His kingdom was not of this world. We, as Believers, live in God's Kingdom through our faith in Jesus Christ, and living as Jesus would by the leading of the Holy Spirit. In this way, we are ruled by God and live as God's subjects doing what God desires. Our home is not this world. The Kingdom of God is both now and not yet. It exists now and can be seen in the lives of Jesus' followers. However, the Kingdom of God is not yet in that it hasn't fully come to be in existence.

Second, we see submission of Jesus to God the Father's will. "Overcoming evil is an essential ingredient in the life of Jesus. Not only does he conquer evil in the midst of personal temptation, but he also constantly wrenches men and women free from malignant evil whenever it manifests itself in human suffering and pain. Not surprisingly, as we see in our reading, his opponents don't like this. They accuse him of being in league with the demon Beelzebul. But Jesus responds differently to his opponents' tactics. He refuses to respond to evil with the weapons of evil. He simply points out that their accusations are not logical. If Satan is driving out Satan, then the Evil One is fighting against itself. Instead, Jesus overcomes evil and brings God's kingdom of freedom to all who are held captive by its dark powers."ⁱⁱⁱ Jesus doesn't zap His opponents and get rid of them. Jesus continues to follow the plan of God the Father laid out for Jesus in the Old Testament concerning the Messiah. Jesus submits to God the Father's plan. Jesus is performing ministry the way in which God the Father wants. Jesus could have called twelve legions of angels to His defense, as if He needed angels to defend Him. But Jesus did not, because Jesus provides us with an example of following God the Father's plan through the power of the Holy Spirit. The plan for Jesus to follow was laid out throughout the Old Testament. For example, Jesus' teaching style changed after the religious leaders made their decision to kill Him. This was according to God the Father's plan laid out in Isaiah.

Bob Deffinbaugh explains, "We know that the disciples asked pointedly why Jesus had begun teaching publicly only by means of parables: "And as soon as He was alone, His followers, along with the twelve, began asking Him about the parables" (Mark 4:10). The answer to this question is hardly what we would have expected. While Jesus revealed truths pertaining to the 'mystery of the Kingdom' to His intimates, He deliberately concealed these truths from those who were 'outside' (verse 11) by the use of parables. This decisive change of course on the part of our Lord was not something new or unexpected. Indeed, it was consistent with the principle revealed in the book of Isaiah: "in order that while seeing, they may see and not perceive; and while hearing, they may hear and not understand lest they return again and be forgiven" (Isaiah 6:9; Mark 4:12).55.

Jesus had claimed to be God's Messiah and Israel's Savior, but, as we have seen from chapters two and three of Mark's gospel, this message was rejected by the leadership of the nation. They were already plotting to kill Him. <u>Finally, they went so far as to accuse Him of working as the servant of</u> <u>Satan. In the light of their committing 'the unpardonable sin,' Jesus now spoke in such a way as to</u> <u>conceal further revelation of His Kingdom from them. He would not cast His pearls before swine</u>.

Jesus on the one hand was concealing the truth from some (Mark 4:10-12), while revealing it to others (4:32-34). The parables incited curiosity and deeper thought on the part of true seekers (cf. Proverbs 25:2; Mark 4:10,34). The parables enabled Jesus to teach publicly, and yet not give His opponents evidence to use against Him. While the scribes and Pharisees were able to understand that the parables were, at times, directed against them, they could not gain from them the hard evidence they needed to dispose of Jesus (Matthew 21:45,46).³¹¹ Here we see that Jesus followed God the Father's plan in the way He taught about the Kingdom of God. Jesus was able to submit Himself to God the Father. We are to do the same.

<u>How do we submit ourselves to God</u>? **First, we continually ask God to do this work of grace in our lives,** so that we may submit to the Holy Spirit more and more. Submission isn't usually a one and done work of the Holy Spirit. The Holy Spirit usually transforms us and allows us to submit to God little by little. **Second, we practice the Means of Grace and Works of Mercy to experience the Holy Spirit in a real relationship.** This allows us to get to know the Holy Spirit's character and recognize how the Holy Spirit speaks to us. Doing these two actions over and over and over will allow us, little by little, to submit ourselves more fully to the Holy Spirit.

Conclusion

What is your first thought when you hear the word "submit?" Is it a word that reminds you of peace, hope, and joy? Is it a word that conjures fear?

When we submit to God, we are allowing God to have God's way in our lives. The truth is, we don't submit to God willingly. We must be forced to do so, and this is a work of grace and mercy by God in our lives.

Jesus had many who opposed Him during His earthly ministry. Jesus did not just zap them and get rid of them. Jesus submitted to God the Father's plan and changed His teaching style by using parables. This teaching style allowed those who wanted to learn to do so but kept Jesus' opponents from having definitive evidence that Jesus was speaking against and about them. We are to follow Jesus' example by the power of the Holy Spirit. Amen.
