3DQ - 3 Discipleship questions to ask each other: What is God saying to you? What are you going to do about it? How can I help?

We will take each area an give one application point.

- 1. We are family. Reread Colossians 4:12. Consider how Epaphras labored on behalf of others ... IN PRAYER. Make a list of three people to spend this next few weeks praying for their maturity: 1. Someone close to you. 2. Someone you know that is going through a difficult time 3. Someone who is difficult for you (that easily frustrates you or has hurt you or disappointed you in some way)
- 2. We are ministers. Consider how commitment to serve others comes because the value of it has been revealed to you. This often comes through a specific experience. (discuss this reality) Where could you be challenged to step out and serve in a way that is different than what you have experienced before? Look for God to surprise you and either -- give you a new place that you can serve OR clarify an area of weakness for you and strength for others -- refining where you might serve in the future.
