

In three of the four gospels, we read that Jesus asks
His disciples, "Who do men say that I am?" But then
Jesus gets even more personal and asks His disciples,
"Who do you say that I am?"

In each account of Jesus asking His disciples who they believe Him to be, He continues to tell them that if anyone desires to come after Him, (to take on a Christ-like identity) they must deny themselves and take up their own cross.

In this workshop, we will learn how to live our lives in a way that people will know who we are, in Christ Jesus because of who Jesus says we are... our Christ identity!

- How do we encourage our children to identify biblically instead of culturally?
