The Light of the World John 7, 8; Matthew 5:14–16 August 14, 2022

Main idea:

When Jesus exclaimed that He is "the Light of the world" in John 8:12, His message was that He is God made flesh, and the Savior of all who follow Him (8:12b). His disciples are also "the light of the world" (Matthew 5:14) but in the sense that they are His witnesses who are charged with the obligation of living out the implications of their faith in Him every day in the view of others (5:15,16).
